GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The one City Council Meeting this month will take place on Wednesday, December 8th, at 6:30 p.m. The City Council will consider approval of a concept plan for the Smiling H Subdivision (136 proposed lots) at approximately 700E 2500N. There will be appointments to the Planning Commission and the Design Review Board. The City Council will also consider approving updates to the North Logan City Employee Handbook.

The Planning Commission Meetings will take place on Thursdays, December 2nd and 16th, at 6:30 p.m. The Planning Commission will be considering a potential rezone of property at approximately 2350E 2700N to RE-2. The Commission will also consider updating requirements for ingress and egress for new subdivisions.

- * Secure gifts and other valuables in your trunk or out of sight while shopping. Thieves look for easy opportunities.

WATER

If you have a backflow assembly, remember to remove it for winter, or cover it to avoid parts breaking from freezing. If you're planning to be out of town for a longer period of time over the winter, remember to keep your heater on to avoid pipes bursting from freezing.

SEWER

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility/sewer bill all year.

STORMWATER

The Stormwater Management Program has been approved by the City Council and is now active. Into these colder months, we ask you to please let us know if the storm drain around your property needs any service. We can only use the street sweeper for a little while longer, so getting that information to us will help in keeping drainage open and flowing.

STREETS

Please remember that **Winter Parking Restrictions are in place**, and there is **no parking allowed on city roadways from 1:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.** until the last day in February. Officers will be issuing citations to those violating the overnight parking ordinance.

Also, when clearing the snow from your driveways, remember it is against the law to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, and children trying to pass on their way to school. Thank you for your cooperation!
