An individual seeking to become a candidate for a municipal office shall file a Declaration of Candidacy in-Person with the City Recorder between **June 1 and June 7** during normal business hours.

Individuals seeking to nominate a candidate shall file a Nomination Petition In-Person with the City Recorder between **June 1 and June 7** during normal business hours.

**The City Council Meetings will take place on Wednesdays, May 5th and 19th, at 6:30 p.m.** The City Council will consider approving a tentative FY2022 municipal budget at the first meeting in May, along with a Public Hearing to receive input on a draft loan application with the Community Impact Board. There is a potential that a revision to the Canyon Gates Development Agreement could be considered in May.

**The Planning Commission Meetings will take place on Thursdays, May 6th and 20th, at 6:30 p.m.** There will be a joint City Council and Planning Commission workshop on May 20th where they will discuss items related to zoning and the General Plan. The Planning Commission will also discuss changes to the code regarding public and private recreation centers.

## WATER DEPARTMENT/STREETS

Construction has begun on 300 E from 2400 N to Meadow View Park. A grant has allowed us to replace the aging water line along 300 E. Due to the extent of the replacement of the water line, the road surface will also be replaced. The project is expected to be completed by July 1st. Please avoid driving or parking on this street when possible.

## WATER CONSERVATION

As the days get warmer, you may feel that it is time to turn on your sprinkler system. With the variety of weather that North Logan City receives in the spring, outdoor culinary water users should take time to learn what their lawns actually need. Generally, in the month of May, watering your lawns 2 days per week will be enough. And in the month of June, a maximum of three times per week. We encourage you to be prepared for the summer by checking out [Slowtheflow.org](http://Slowtheflow.org) and [conservewater.utah.gov](http://conservewater.utah.gov) to find conservation tips; QWEL Certified Irrigation Pros; and, recommendations on how much water you need, which is updated each week so that your lawns and plantings look their best this year, while using appropriate amounts of water.

Residents on a Secondary Water system, please follow all guidelines given to you by your Line Manager and the Irrigation or Canal Company.
