NORTH PARK POLICE

The North Park Police Department, in conjunction with the DEA, will be participating in a "Drug Take Back Program" on Saturday, October 23rd. Look for more information soon on the North Park Police Department's Facebook page for the location and times. That day will be an opportunity for you to bring in all prescription medications that need to be destroyed; although PLEASE NOTE, you may NOT bring in needles of any kind, or over-the-counter medications. Please contact the North Park Police Department at (435) 753-7600 for questions or more information.

I would also like to remind our citizens that there are drug take-back boxes located at the North Park Police Department, and the Hyde Park City Offices. You are encouraged to utilize these drop boxes during regular business hours. We do ask that you only use these drop boxes for disposal of acceptable medications. Please visit www.brhd.org for a list of what is acceptable. We Do Not accept sharps (needles) of any kind. There are also other locations throughout the valley where you can take your unused prescription medication for proper disposal.

North Park Police Department is still hiring for multiple crossing guard positions. If you or someone you know would like to be part of our team here at NPPD, please swing by the office or go to northparkpolice.org and fill out an application.

In addition, there will be several items on the agenda related to fees, including Emergency Response/Dispatch Fee, Stormwater Fees, and Water Tiered Rate Updates.

The Planning Commission Meetings will take place on Thursdays, October 7th and 21st, at 6:30 p.m. The Planning Commission will continue their discussion regarding updates to the Ingress/Egress requirements for roads and road slopes. They will also discuss water requirements for subdivisions, along with General Plan updates.
