SNOW REMOVAL & PARKING

When clearing the snow from your driveways, remember **it is against the law** to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, and children trying to pass on their way to school. Thank you for your cooperation!

Also, **Winter parking** restrictions are in effect. Parking is not allowed on any North Logan roadway from 1:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. daily, from November 15th to the last day of February. Please be sure to have your **vehicles off the streets** so the plow drivers can keep the roads clear of snow this winter. North Park Police officers will be issuing citations if you are in violation of the code.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council Meetings will take place on Wednesdays, February 3rd and 17th. In February, the City Council will be looking at a budget revision for the current fiscal year, and considering budget proposals from the Community Development and Building Inspection Departments for the coming fiscal year. In addition, the City Council will consider adopting the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan that was prepared by the Bear River Association of Governments.

The Planning Commission Meetings will take place Thurs., February 4th and 18th. The Planning Commission will be looking at modifications to the City Center Code. In addition, there may be a discussion regarding the Canyon Gates Subdivision located at approximately 2300N 1600E.

Illicit Storm Water Discharge: "Any discharge to a municipal separate storm sewer that is not composed entirely of storm water." VEHICLE REGISTRATION

As you likely already know, the Utah Division of Motor Vehicles no longer sends out their postcard reminders letting people know when their vehicle registration is due; however, you CAN sign up on their site to receive email reminders telling you when it is due. Go to the following site to sign up: <https://dmv.utah.gov/register/renewal>

Just after the first paragraph at the top, there is a link you can go to where you will need to put in some brief, pertinent information, including the plate number of the car, and the last four digits of the vehicle's VIN number, and your email, and you will receive email notices for your vehicle. You can also register your car on line and have the stickers mailed to you.
