

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

When you receive this newsletter, we will be headed into summer. A great time of the year to enjoy family, friends and our great community. We live in a great place. Do you know that Utah is also one of the driest states in the nation and our population continues to trend upward?

This past winter, we experienced below-average snow depth. When coupled with the very dry year we experienced last summer, it causes concern for our water situation. There are several resources to help us be water-smart. A water check analyzes the efficiency of your sprinkler irrigation system. Trained evaluators can come to your location to perform a water check. Beginning May 1st, you can sign up for a water check in Cache County at cwel.usu.edu/watercheck or call 435-797-5529.

Slowtheflow.org is another great resource for water conservation tips. Indoor tips include: fill your sink to rinse vegetable and dishes rather than letting the water run; use full loads in your washing machine, etc. Outdoor tips include: water-wise landscapes and plants; adjust sprinklers so they don't spray on sidewalks and driveways, etc. I refer you to these resources for a complete list and to learn more. As the summer progresses, please pay close attention to sensible water conservation practices.

An individual seeking to become a candidate for a municipal office shall file a Declaration of Candidacy in-person with the City Recorder between June 1 and June 7 during normal business hours.

Individuals seeking to nominate a candidate shall file a Nomination Petition in-person with the City Recorder between June 1 and June 7 during normal business hours.

Cache Recreation Complex Pickleball Courts (2850N 300E): 8 Pickleball Courts will be installed at the Cache Recreation Complex. These 8 Pickleball courts will be completed by late summer.

Playground at Elk Ridge Park: As you may have seen, the playground and swing sets have been removed from Elk Ridge Park. The removed items were outdated and unsafe. We have plans to expand the existing playground and have ordered all of the equipment. We are very excited about the coming features. It should be installed at the beginning of August.

BMX Track at Elk Ridge West (2500N 950E): The dirt BMX and pump tracks are almost completed. We are still working on a few items to finish them up. If you are interested in helping maintain these tracks, please contact ryan@northlogancity.org. Look for a date in July for a Grand Opening.

Parking Lot at Elk Ridge East (2300N 1200E): We are currently working on the final touches to the parking lot and will have it paved soon. There will also be segments of trail done to complete an exterior loop around Elk Ridge Park.

3100 North Roadway: Construction is moving along swiftly. We are planning to open the road in mid-June, a couple of months ahead of schedule. The multi-use path that connects 1600E to Green Canyon High School will also be completed in June.

300E: Waterline and road work are underway on 300E. This is a big project and we thank the residents for their understanding and cooperation. This should be completed in July.

STORMWATER

The Street Sweeper is going to be used daily starting this month. As you see it driving, proceed with caution for you, the people around you, and the North Logan City employee operating the sweeper. There will be directional lights on the back side of the sweeper so as you approach follow those directions. We would also like to remind you that any landscaping being done can impact our waterways, so remember not to dump any lawn clippings or debris into the roadway as well as canal areas. WATER CONSERVATION

Culinary Outdoor Water Users:

With spring run-off being significantly lower than most years and the State of Utah being in drought conditions, we are asking for your help. Governor Cox has issued a State-wide Water Optimization Program and North Logan City is committed to lead the way in water conservation. Please think of ways you can help to conserve water. This is a year where having green, lush grass is not going to be possible. Some possible ideas are simply cutting back on sprinkler watering times to 3 days per week and 20 minutes per zone, or perhaps look at water-wise and xeriscape landscaping options. We all need to do our part to conserve so the city is not put in an emergency situation. The city is already adjusting sprinkler times to cut back watering city-owned properties. You will see the cemetery and city-owned parks not as green as you have in the past. Let's all work together to conserve, so that restrictive measures don't have to be taken. One thing we all need to remember is that we live in a desert, and water is a precious resource and not an unlimited supply. Please be wise with water use this summer.

There are tools, rebates, and guides available to help you at slowtheflow.org. If anyone is unsure if they are tied to culinary water for outdoor watering, please give us a call 435-752-1310.

STREETS

- Streets crews are out working on the roadways, so be mindful and slow down for them.
- With warm weather kicking off, we would like to remind everyone doing landscaping or building projects that landscape/building materials cannot be stored in the roadway. Any materials dumped in the roadway needs to be moved within 24 hours. If they remain beyond this time period, then the city workers can haul that material off at owners' expense if it is interfering with maintenance work.
- Ramping curb and gutter to access lots with dirt is not allowed. Ramps must be made with clean rock or boards so water can be allowed to flow through without carrying sediment down the roadway and gutter. Ramps may not remain for an extended period of time.

FIREWORKS - REGULATIONS

Due to drought conditions, the discharging of fireworks will not be allowed for the following areas and dates this year:

East Bench Area:

- East of 1600 East from the northern city boundary to the southern city boundary.

Dates of Restrictions:

- June 24, 2021 through July 25, 2021.

What is Allowed:

- Fireworks may be discharged between the hours of 11:00 a.m. - 11:00 p.m., July 2 - July 5 (hours are extended to midnight on July 4) and July 22-July 25 (hours are extended midnight on July 24).
- Fireworks are legally sold from June 24-July 25.
