GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council Meetings this month will take place on Wednesdays, February 2nd and 16th, at 6:30 p.m. The City Council will consider a revision to this year's budget, and departmental budget proposals (Community Development, Building Inspection, Fire, Econ Development) for next fiscal year will begin. There will also be updates to the Access and Ingress/Egress requirements for developments and subdivisions.

The Planning Commission Meetings will take place on Thursdays, February 3rd and 17th, at 6:30 p.m. The Planning Commission will be discussing the Water Conservation Ordinance for new subdivisions, the Digital Submittal Ordinance, updates to the Post Division Approval Ordinance, Adoption of Elements of the International Fire Code - Appendix D, and a potential workshop with the City Council.

WATER

North Logan's Cross Connection Control Program ensures that our public drinking water supply is safe and protected. In order to do so, we require businesses to have their backflows tested annually. Please submit your 2022 backflow certifications as soon as possible. Also, starting in 2022, all new homes built will be required to adhere to this same standard. We highly encourage homes with a backflow assembly to have theirs tested annually, as well. If you are unsure if you have a backflow assembly on your irrigation system, email Jon at jmills@northlogancity.org for assistance or questions.

SEWER/STORMWATER

The EPA's [Household Hazardous Waste \(HHW\)](http://www.epa.gov/hhw) program has more advice on how to safely manage and reduce the use of these materials.

If your property is on septic, here is a reminder to take a look and properly maintain your septic system.

STREETS

The Streets Dept. will be trimming trees which are encroaching into the road and/or sidewalk throughout the city. (7 feet above sidewalk, 12 feet above road from back of curb.)

Please remember that **Winter Parking Restrictions are in place, and there is NO parking allowed on city roadways from 1:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.** until the last day in February. Officers will be issuing citations to those violating the overnight parking ordinance.

Also, when clearing the snow from your driveways, remember it is against the law to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, children trying to pass on their way to school, and neighbors walking or exercising.
