Did you know that North Logan has the longest-running and largest Pioneer Day program in the valley? We will be celebrating on Monday, July 25th this year, and have an array of activities planned to celebrate our pioneer founders. **Please note that this year we are adjusting the parade route to end at Elk Ridge Park.**

Also, we are ecstatic about the work the Library and the Friends of the Library have put into creating some great events that will raise money for our new community center/library expansion. We also appreciate the outpouring of community and business support we've received throughout the valley! They've made it easy for you to find a way to support these new facilities: whether through eating out on designated days at Kneaders, Cafe Rio and Noodles and Company, attending super fun events, or even stepping up to dunk the mayor at the closing social on August 12th. The Planning Commission Meetings this month will take place on Thursdays, July 7th and 21st at 6:30 p.m. The Planning Commission will consider approving recommended updates to the City's Moderate Income Housing Plan, and adopting the North Logan City Active Transportation Plan.

Due to drought conditions, the discharging of fireworks will not be allowed for the following areas and dates this year:

East Bench Area:

- * East of 1600 East from the northern city boundary to the southern city boundary.

What is Allowed:

- * Fireworks may be discharged between the hours of 11:00 a.m. - 11:00 p.m., July 2 - July 5 (hours are extended to midnight on July 4) and July 22-July 25 (hours are extended midnight on July 24).
- * Fireworks are legally sold from June 24-July 25.

STREETS

The Streets Department will be preparing for our surface treatments in the coming weeks. Chipsealing of roads will take place July 5th-8th. The locations and expected time of chipsealing will be as follows:

1. (July 5) Meadowview neighborhood (230 E, 270 E, 330 E, 370 E.)
2. (July 6) 200 E and the south section, Wolfpack Way from 1500 N to 3100 N.
3. (July 7) 2850 N from Main Street to 400 E, and the north section of Wolfpack Way.
4. (July 8) 2100 N from 600 E to 1600 E.

There is a possibility of scheduling adjustments so this is NOT a finite schedule. There will be road closures on these roads and in the surrounding area. This is to ensure safety and efficiency for our crews. Please plan accordingly and be courteous to our crews during this time.

If you reside along these routes, we ask that vehicles, trailers, materials, etc. be removed from asphalt surfaces so that we can prepare the road in advance of our treatments. Any vehicles, trailers, etc. that are not removed on the day of treatment will be subject to being towed if the owner cannot be located quickly.

STORMWATER

Think of your lawn's possible impacts on the environment regarding lawn care. Consider these steps and ideas when caring for your lawn and garden.

1. September is the best month to use fertilizer. When using fertilizer, use slow-release or time-release with soluble nitrogen.
2. A common myth is that more is synonymous with better when discussing lawn health. That isn't always the case! Someone should only use two pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet. Implementing this practice will give you the best results and save you money.
3. Leave grass clippings on the lawn to reduce the need for fertilizer and promote a more full and healthy lawn.
4. Spot treat weeds when you can't handpick them and don't douse the entire area.
5. Know the weather ahead and don't apply fertilizers or pesticides when rain or other weather events are forecasted in the immediate future.
6. Sweep driveways and sidewalks rather than washing with a hose.
7. For more information, visit <https://cfpub.epa.gov/npstbx/files/riswlawm.pdf>. Remember that the chemicals used or disposed of should not make it into a stormwater drain when washing or working on motorized vehicles. Use drip pans when needed and keep a spill kit nearby, and try to wash your vehicle at a designated car wash station. A friendly reminder: Canals are stormwater ways too. These should not be dammed up or used as a trash bin. If you notice an abundance of debris like trash, sticks, lawn clippings, and more, don't hesitate to get in touch with the city office so we can go out and keep the canals clean.

This month we will be out chipsealing roadways. If you see mats in your inlet boxes, please leave those in place; they are to protect our waterways from the oils and rock used in the process of treating the road.

Don't forget, we all live downstream, and the smallest item is the biggest problem down the way.

FLIP THE STRIP

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan City will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Initially, this will be for commercial only, with residential to follow later.

NOTICE

North Logan City Culinary Water User Conservation Measures July 2022

Culinary water restrictions are currently ongoing. We are actively monitoring the situation and will adjust restrictions as needed. Water users shall water landscaping **no more than TWO** days per week and are encouraged to water less where possible. Priority should be given to trees, shrubs or bushes, flowers, and gardens. Lawn watering should be considered a low priority. Check northlogancity.org for any regular updates.

Requirements:

- **ODD addresses are permitted to water on Mondays and Fridays. EVEN addresses are permitted to water on Tuesdays and Saturdays.**
- **No watering on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Sundays.**
- **Residences that utilize secondary water are prohibited from switching to culinary water for lawn watering for the entire watering season.**
- No excessive or wasteful watering.

Secondary (Canal) Water Users:

Please coordinate with your respective canal head gate/pipeline manager. Further information regarding secondary water restrictions can be found at cachehighline.com, or the Hyde Park Irrigation Company (Twin Ditch Canal) at (435) 881-3461.

Notes on Large Commercial Properties:

North Logan is home to many large commercial communities, properties, and HOAs. Due to their expansive size, these properties may need to water outside the designated address schedule to accommodate all irrigation needs. Various agreements have been made to ensure that these properties still maintain two waterings, or less, per week.

Written Warning:

If a water user is observed using inordinate amounts of water, or is ignoring the rules and regulations set in the City's water shortage policies, procedures, and the associated water shortage reduction strategies; the property owner will be notified of the violation by a letter, door hanger, and/or e-mail from the City's Utilities Department. Door hangers will include your address, date of violation, the current number of days permitted to water, and the correct days to water based on your address. A maximum of 2 written warnings will be issued. If a consumer continues to violate water restrictions after 2 written warnings, a Water Conservation Violation will be issued alongside a \$100 fine. Any additional violations will be accompanied with a \$300 fine and the possibility of water shut off. The City Public Utility Manager recognizes that there are special circumstances when a property owner may need to deviate from water shortage policies. The Public Utility Manager will have the ability to allow for special watering when a property owner can demonstrate an extraordinary circumstance requiring more water than is permitted by a particular phase reduction strategy.

How long should you water?:

The Utah Division of Drinking Water Resources provides great tools and information on how long you should water. 1/2" of water is considered one watering. Different types of sprinkler heads require different amounts of time to achieve 1/2" of water, among other factors. Visit conservewater.utah.gov/weekly-lawn-watering-guide/ for more information.

In addition, City staff are available to provide resources for helping with water reduction.
