**The City Council Meetings this month will take place on Wednesdays, January 5<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 p.m.** The City Council will be considering the concept plan for the Smiling H proposed subdivision located at ~ 2500N 700E. There may be a discussion regarding a potential 7-lot subdivision at approximately 2300E 2600N. The City Council will also discuss adopting changes to the ingress and egress standards for subdivisions.

## WATER

If you have a backflow assembly, remember to remove it for winter, or cover it to avoid parts breaking from freezing. If you're planning to be out of town for a longer period of time over the winter, remember to keep your heater on to avoid pipes bursting from freezing.

## STORMWATER

### **Reminder to Use and Dispose of Harmful Materials Properly:**

Don't pour hazardous waste down the drain, on the ground, or into inlet boxes. This could contaminate the soil, groundwater, or nearby surface water.

A number of products used at home contain hazardous or toxic substances that can contaminate ground or surface waters, such as:

- Motor oil
- Pesticides
- Leftover paints or paint cans
- Mothballs
- Flea collars
- Household cleaners
- A number of medicines

## SEWER

The EPA's [Household Hazardous Waste \(HHW\)](http://www.epa.gov/hhw) program has more advice on how to safely manage and reduce the use of these materials.

If your property is on septic, here is a reminder to take a look and properly maintain your septic system.

## STREETS

The Streets Dept. will be trimming trees which are encroaching into the road and/or sidewalk throughout the city. (7 feet above sidewalk, 12 feet above road from back of curb.)

Please remember that **Winter Parking Restrictions are in place**, and there is **no parking allowed on city roadways from 1:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.** until the last day in February. Officers will be issuing citations to those violating the overnight parking ordinance.

Also, when clearing the snow from your driveways, remember it is against the law to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, children trying to pass on their way to school, and neighbors walking or exercising. Thank you!!
