GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council will only hold ONE MEETING IN OCTOBER, on Wednesday, October 19th at 6:30 p.m. The City Council will have a presentation from CAPSA regarding Domestic Violence Awareness Month, along with an update regarding the Wellness Survey conducted by USU. The City Council may also consider a permit for a new electrical substation in the General Commercial Area of the City.

The Planning Commission will only hold ONE MEETING IN OCTOBER, on Thursday, October 20th at 6:30 p.m. The Planning Commission meets in the North Logan Library's multipurpose room. The Planning Commission will likely hold a public hearing on the 20th regarding potential amendments to the City's signage ordinance and its regulations specific to non-conforming signage. Other planning items may be discussed.

To stay informed on planning topics in the City, all Planning Commission & City Council agendas are published at least 24 hours in advance of any scheduled meetings on the Utah Public Notice website (utah.gov). Feel free to create an account on the utah.gov site and follow the North Logan City Council or Planning Commission to receive notifications of upcoming meetings. We also post our agendas on our website and on the North Logan City Facebook and Instagram pages prior to the meetings. STORMWATER

It's October, which means we are heading into the fall months, and that the leaves are falling off of the trees. City workers will be running our street sweeper constantly to keep up with cleaning the roads and gutters in preparation for snowfall. Please do your part to keep as much of your leaves and debris out of the road and gutters, as possible. Properly dispose of them in green waste bins or by taking them to the Logan Landfill.

WATER

The Water Department would like to remind you that as the temperatures drop, to remember to blow out your sprinkler system to avoid freezing pipes. If you have a backflow assembly, remember to remove it for winter, or cover it to avoid parts breaking from freezing. If you're planning to be out of town for a longer period of time over the winter, remember to keep your heater on to avoid pipes bursting from freezing.

STREETS

For the month of October, our Streets Dept. will be applying thermoplastic and/or paint to the roads that were surface-treated this year. This process requires that traffic not drive on the new markings until they have dried. We plan to leave travel lanes open and just apply a section at a time. In some cases, it may be necessary to close a travel lane. Example: Roundabouts with narrow entry/exit points. This will be a last resort.

FLIP THE STRIP

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Water utility bill credits will be available for participants. Please, watch the city's website (northlogancity.org) and social media for details in the coming months. Initially, this will be for commercial only, with residential to follow later.

SPLASH PAD - WATER USE

After hearing some concerns about water use at our Elk Ridge Park Splash Pad this summer, we wanted you to be aware that the splash pad is a recirculating system that uses next to nothing on water. We also only run it a few days per week, for only a few hours on those days. We have received many requests from citizens, particularly parents, who would like us to it run for additional hours and days; but as a City, we are trying to provide a feature that is one of our most requested, while also staying committed to the strictest water conservation measures that we possibly can.

The North Logan City Water Department would like to thank all of the residents and businesses of North Logan for their efforts in following, respecting, and adapting to the culinary water management plan in place this summer. Many of you did a great job. Some still need to understand that this is a group effort, and perhaps can do more in the future. As the drought conditions remain, the supply and availability of water are decreasing. North Logan City is taking measures right now to counter these concerns and improve the water situation.

We saw a 30 percent water reduction in the months of June and July 2022 compared to 2021. This was our goal. We saw some very high users cut their use by nearly 60 percent.

For August and September 2022, the total use by all connections was equal to August and September 2021. Still, this is an advantage to maintaining an equilibrium in the supply and demand of water.

North Logan City will start drilling a new culinary water production well in mid-October. We are hopeful that this well will be available for use this next summer.

In addition, the City will be constructing several million gallons of water storage this next summer. This should significantly help with the high culinary water demand.

As a reminder: your monthly sewer rate for the year is based on your winter water use. We use your winter (November through April) water usage to calculate what you use inside the home; as this is what goes into the sewer. If you want to make your sewer rate lower, don't use culinary water on your exterior landscaping during those winter months. Also, check and maintain that you don't have a leak in your sprinkler system. A lot of times, that is the point of high use, and it can change your average over the winter, which subsequently affects your sewer bill each month throughout the year.
