GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council Meetings in November will take place on Wednesdays, Nov. 2nd & Nov. 16th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The City Council will be discussing a proposed warming center at the Cache Valley Veterans Association Building in North Logan. There will also be an update to the City's sign ordinance; as well as an ordinance updating the zoning matrix regarding government buildings. The annual audit report is tentatively scheduled for the second meeting in November, along with a discussion regarding ranked choice voting.

The Planning Commission Meetings in November will take place on Thursdays, Nov. 3rd & Nov. 17th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to discuss a Concept Plan proposal for the Christopher Taylor 2-lot subdivision located at approximately 2100 North and 1700 East. Additionally, the Planning Commission may discuss current and potential modifications to the zoning provisions for small multi-unit storage units. Additional items may be discussed in November, depending on applications received throughout the month.

To stay informed on planning topics in the City, all Planning Comm. & City Council agendas are published at least 24 hours in advance of any scheduled meetings on the Utah Public Notice website (utah.gov). Feel free to create an account on the utah.gov site and follow the North Logan City Council or Planning Commission to receive notifications of upcoming meetings. We also post our agendas on our website and on the North Logan City Facebook and Instagram pages prior to the meetings. NORTH PARK POLICE

November is a wonderful time of the year as fall is ushered in with the changing of leaves and cooler temperatures. Family events and outings are commonplace. As we are all too aware, tragedy can strike quickly. To that end, I wanted to focus on several safety tips, that if followed, will help each of our families avoid tragedy.

Recently, the North Park Police Department has fielded several calls/complaints regarding youth riders on motorcycles and ATV's speeding in the upper bench areas and streets of North Logan and Hyde Park. The downhill grade along 3100 North makes it easy to reach higher speeds quickly. When a citizen calls Dispatch or the Police Department to report these types of incidents, a call is generated, and our officers respond to them. Quite often by the time the officers arrive in the area, the riders are gone, making it impossible to have a conversation with these youths. In addition, young riders are often inexperienced and have not received proper training.

We are asking for families who have children that ride motorcycles or ATVs in the upper bench areas of North Logan or Hyde Park, to take the time to talk with their youth about the dangers of speeding/reckless driving. As a rider increases speed, the ability to stop safely decreases significantly if a child, pet, bouncing ball, or car were to suddenly appear in the street. By law, helmets are required to be worn for those operators under the age of twenty-one. (41-6a-1505 Utah Code). The hope is to prevent a tragedy by shedding some light on this topic.

Another area of concern is with the new roadway under construction, north of the roundabout, near Green Canyon High School, along Wolf Pack Way. After school is let out, youth riders on dirt bikes and ATVs are riding on the unfinished road, unaware of open trench lines and holes that have been dug by workers during the day. These trench lines and holes present serious safety concerns for unaware bikers. We are asking that riders do not ride anywhere along this roadway while it's under construction.

We want to remind everyone that the winter overnight parking ordinance goes in to effect, as of November 1st, as follows:

11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking Prohibited - No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of midnight (12:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day, beginning November 1st and ending March 31st of the following year, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.

Officers will be issuing citations to those violating this ordinance.

The North Park Police Department, in conjunction with the DEA, will be participating in a **"Drug Take Back Program"** on Saturday, October 29th from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Cache Valley Specialty Hospital. That day will be an opportunity for citizens to bring in any unused or old prescription medication to be disposed of properly. PLEASE NOTE, you may not bring in needles of any kind, or over the counter medications. As a reminder, there are drug take back boxes located in the lobby of the Police Department that can be utilized during business hours as well.

We want to thank those who have come into the office to show support or express appreciation to our officers. Please be safe. If you have questions or concerns, please reach out.

STREETS

North Logan City's winter parking ordinance goes into effect November 1st and will end March 31st. This means that there is no overnight parking allowed along the roadways between the hours of 12:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. This ordinance is in effect regardless of whether or not there is snow in the forecast. During snow removal, this allows our plow drivers to safely and efficiently clear our roads. North Logan City is not responsible for any damages to vehicles that are in violation of this ordinance. With winter approaching, please make sure that property and debris are removed from the roadway. Thank you for your cooperation!

FLIP THE STRIP

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Water utility bill credits will be available for participants. Please, watch the city's website northlogancity.org and social media for details in the coming months. Initially, this will be for commercial only, with residential to follow later.

HEATING ASSISTANT PROG.

Starting on October 17th, at 6:00 a.m., Cache County homeowners have the opportunity to upgrade their wood stove or fireplace to gas, through the Wood Stove and Fireplace Conversion Assistance Program, per the following:

- Must be legal owner of the home; rental properties not eligible.
- Low-income homeowners can receive up to \$4,300 to help with conversion costs.
- Stove or fireplace must be used for a significant amount of home heating.
- Visit stoves.utah.gov for more information and registration details.



STORMWATER

November means we are still heavy into the fall season. This can mean heavy rainstorms, but it definitely means fallen leaves and other debris. Please keep the following guidelines in mind to help do your part to keep the city clean and storm drains functioning properly:

1. Keep your leaves and other debris out of the street, gutter, and sidewalks.
2. Keep leaves and debris away from the tops of storm drains. City workers will be running our street sweeper, but it is a large city and we cannot be everywhere at once.
3. Put collected leaves and other debris in proper disposal containers to avoid them washing into the storm drains.

With winter coming and the possibilities of snow, here are a few reminders:

1. Keep your pushed snow off of storm drains, out of the street, and away from the curb and gutter.
2. Please do not overuse ice melt to help keep pollutants out of the storm drain, as well.

WATER

The Water Department would like to remind you that as the temperatures drop, to remember to blow out your sprinkler system to avoid freezing pipes. If you have a backflow assembly, remember to remove it for winter, or cover it to avoid parts breaking from freezing. If you're planning to be out of town for a longer period of time over the winter, remember to keep your heater on to avoid pipes bursting from freezing.

SEWER

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.

CEMETERY DECORATIONS

Cemetery Flower & Decoration Removal

On November 18th, the city will discard all decorations and flowers from the North Logan Cemetery that appear out of condition or are not in compliance with the City's Cemetery Ordinance, including shepherds hooks. This cleaning takes place semi-annually after the Memorial Day and Veterans Day holidays. Below is an excerpt from the Cemetery Ordinance. For the full ordinance please go to the city website:

"Glass containers are prohibited...small baskets, pots, cans, vases, toys, flowers, decorations of any kind are acceptable as long as they remain within the 6" concrete base (mowing strip) on the north and/or south of the headstone/monument. Shepherds hooks, pinwheels, etc. are permitted only within the places specifically provided for such in the headstone, mowing strip. All decorations, vases, toys, etc., are discouraged on the east and/or west mowing strip of the headstone, as these items may need to be removed."
