

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

My Grandpa Jo, referencing a different valley--one in much the same situation as ours is today--said "Water is the lifeblood of our valley. Use it wisely."

As we enter summer and the peak months for water use, we start in Phase 3 (orange) and are working toward reducing our culinary water consumption by 30-40%. One way we are encouraging this reduction is by increasing culinary water rates for the city's highest users, while water rates for the average user will remain the same. We're hoping this encourages conservation and preserves the city's ability to provide culinary water throughout these peak summer months. We've also created a separate tier of water rates and extremely restrictive conservation requirements for new builds reliant on culinary water. These restrictions and fees stop short of a building moratorium but strongly encourage potential new builds to conserve water and to landscape yards accordingly.

This year's water outlook is particularly bleak as we endure a second consecutive year of severe drought conditions. Some sobering statistics from our water department:

- Last year our primary year-round water source went dry for the first time in 100 years.
- While we reached a snowpack of 80% in the winter of '21-'22, an estimated 30% of that water goes straight to saturating the ground (meaning it doesn't end up as flowing water or aquifer recharge).
- To replenish four dry years, we'd need 200% snowpack to reach the point of storing excess water.

And some suggestions:

- **Wait to water:** wait until temperatures consistently reach 70+ degrees before beginning to water outdoors.
- **Water when it's coolest:** don't water between the hours of 10 a.m.-6 p.m.
- **Raise your mower:** set blades at 3"-4" to shade roots and reduce evaporation.
- **Consider long-term solutions:** reduce turf in your yard, plant drought-resistant trees/plants, install a smart controller (large rebates are available at local stores).
- **Participate in an audit:** USU will conduct a free water audit and North Logan city staff is happy to help you come up with ways to conserve.
- **Visit** conservewater.utah.gov, slowtheflow.org, water.utah.gov, extension.usu.edu/waterquality/conservation

We rely on our citizens, now more than ever, to conserve our precious water resources--our valley's lifeblood. As a city, we appreciate North Logan's culture of working together for the better of our community. For our part, we are making progress on infrastructure changes that will bolster our water supply, including new water sources, storage wells, and new water lines. We thank you for doing your part to be stewards of our limited water resources.

STORMWATER

Keep in mind a few common pollutants that tend to occur. When landscaping projects begin and material needs to be stored somewhere, people tend to stage it in the roadway and sidewalk. Instead, you should find a spot on your driveway or locate it where the landscaping material will end up and place it there. These small steps can significantly impact the drainage in our city, and the quality of water we can reuse.

Another common issue that occurs as the weather warms up, is the inability for the snowmelt to drain. The draining issues are caused by debris in and around the inlet boxes; either by snowplows pushing snow, or even ice taking longer to melt. If you notice this happening, please call the city office, and we will be able to come out and fix the issue at hand. We would also like to mention lawn maintenance. Putting lawn clippings and other lawn debris in the canals is strongly discouraged and should be dealt with differently. Logan Landfill will pick up the green waste that you place in the green waste bins at Elk Ridge Park, located by the Parks workshop and new BMX bike track.

The Cache County Stormwater Coalition is canceling this year's Stormwater Fair. The Stormwater Coalition will be pursuing radio ads instead. The airing of these ads will be on some of your favorite stations, so tune in!

STREETS

The Streets Department is beginning to do much more work out on the roads, as is typically done this time of year. We will be moving throughout the city with our street sweeper. Any vehicles on the road will be swept around, and we will not be able to get back to clean up any missed areas, due to the time it takes to cover all of North Logan.

We will also be crack sealing roads, painting intersections, cutting and patching asphalt, and, working on damaged sidewalks. Please be aware, and courteous to our employees as we try to do these services for the citizens of our city.

SEWER

To protect the Health/Safety/and Finances of residents of North Logan City, we are issuing this PSA to inform you that the only item that is allowed to be put into the Sanitary Sewer System, aside from natural waste, is toilet paper! Please **DO NOT** flush items such as wipes (even "flushable" ones, as they *do not* break down in the Sanitary Sewer System), feminine hygiene products, cleaning wipes, paper towels, trash, towels or cloth of any kind, diapers, grease, toys, Q-tips, or prescription and non-prescription drugs, etc. Please dispose of these products properly in solid waste/trash bins. Having the Sanitary Sewer System function properly, and maintaining the health of our community, are important to both North Logan City Administration and Staff.

Although the items that you may flush down the toilet escape your home's plumbing, the sewage blockages that occur in the subsequent, larger pipes affect many more people than just your family. Because the sewer services are a publicly-operated service, the cost to maintain that infrastructure is collected from sewer charges. Sewer back-ups in your home can cost a significant amount of money, as a Hazmat Cleanup service is needed to properly decontaminate the site.

NOTICE

North Logan City Culinary Water User Conservation - May 2022

Conservation measures began April 1st, 2022, and are continuing through the summer. For the month of May, exterior landscape watering should be delayed until mid-May at the earliest, or when the outside air temp averages above 70 degrees, whichever comes later.

Culinary water users shall water landscaping no more than THREE days per week, and are encouraged to water less than three days per week where possible. Priority should be given to trees, shrubs or bushes, flowers, and gardens. Lawn watering should be considered a low priority. Landscape watering should be decreased by 30%-40%.

Requirements:

- **ODD addresses are permitted to water on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. EVEN addresses are permitted to water on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. No watering on Sundays.**
- **Residences that utilize secondary water are prohibited from switching to culinary water for lawn watering for the entire watering season.**
- No excessive or wasteful watering.

Secondary (Canal) Water Users:

Please coordinate with your respective canal head gate/pipeline manager. Further information regarding secondary water restrictions can be found at cachehighline.com, or from the Hyde Park Irrigation Company (Twin Ditch Canal) (435) 881-3461.

Enforcement of these policies has begun. Letters of violation and fines will be issued to those not following the exterior watering schedule.

Definitions:

Culinary Water (City Water) is potable, treated, drinking water supplied to homes by the City. This water can be used throughout the home and exterior and is billed for by North Logan City.

Secondary Water (Canal Water) is non-potable, non-treated water supplied to much of the City by a canal or irrigation company, for purposes of landscape, crop, agriculture, or livestock watering. This water is not owned or managed by North Logan City. Restrictions on secondary water are set by the pipeline managers, which may vary from what North Logan City has set for restrictions.

North Logan City is aware of which residents have secondary water on their property.
