GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council will only meet once in December on Wednesday, Dec. 14th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library.

The City Council will hold a public hearing to receive feedback regarding a proposed resolution to remove the North Logan City residents along the north end of the community from the Hyde Park Cemetery District and their associated annual property tax to the Hyde Park Cemetery District. There will also be a potential discussion regarding the winter parking ordinance and updates to the floodplain ordinance.

The Planning Commission will only meet once in December on Thursday, Dec. 15th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public hearings or work session discussions on the following topics: ♦ A proposal to remove "Small Multi-Unit Storage" and "Large Warehouse-Type Storage" facilities as permitted or conditionally-permitted uses in certain zones. ♦ A proposal to clarify the required surface materials for residential and non-residential parking surfaces. ♦ A proposal to implement an expiration timeline on approved and dormant subdivision concept plans. ♦ A proposal to adjust the subdivision and development standards in the RE-5 zone.

Additional items may be discussed in December, depending on applications received throughout the month.

To stay informed on planning topics in the City, all Planning Comm. & City Council agendas are published at least 24 hours in advance of any scheduled meetings on the Utah Public Notice website (utah.gov). Feel free to create an account on the utah.gov site and follow the North Logan City Council or Planning Commission to receive notifications of upcoming meetings. We also post our agendas on our website and on the North Logan City Facebook and Instagram pages prior to the meetings. If you would like to receive the agendas via email, please send an email requesting so to marie@northlogancity.org to be added to the list. NORTH PARK POLICE

Ready or not, winter is here to stay. When the snow flies, our city snowplow drivers are hindered in their ability to quickly remove the snow from the roads when cars are parked illegally on the street. Please remember our parking restrictions, outlined as follows:

11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking Prohibited

No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of midnight (12:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day, beginning November 1st and ending March 31st of the following year, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.

Our officers will be issuing citations to those who violate the overnight parking ordinance.

We ask that you clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home. Please remember, it is against the law to push or blow snow into the street. We want our residents to navigate through the storms safely.



This is a great time to go out and inspect your vehicles' equipment. Do your tires have proper traction, or are they bald? Please consider replacing them if needed. If your windshield wipers are cracked or broken, they cannot adequately clear snow or water from the windshield.

When going out, please brush/scrape **ALL** the snow from your windshields and allow time for them to defrost. Speed is a large contributing factor in crashes. When winter conditions are present, slow your speed, increase your following distance, and allow yourself plenty of time to reach your destination. Consider the wisdom in having a winter emergency kit in your car. A good winter kit consists of a warm coat, gloves, stocking cap, water bottles, extra food, a flashlight and batteries, and a strong tow strap as a minimum.

If you are involved in an accident, please call 911 or our non-emergency Dispatch number at 435-753-7555 and an officer will respond to assist you.

If there are questions or concerns that we can answer for you, please feel free to contact our office at 435-753-7600. Our office is open during normal business hours M-F 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

DOG LICENSE RENEWAL

Please remember that all dogs living in North Logan must be licensed. Licenses are due on the anniversary date of the rabies vaccination. The cost is \$15 for spayed or neutered, or \$25 for unaltered. We are waiving all late fees through the end of 2022, so if your license is expired, now is the perfect time to renew. STREETS

During the month of December, our Streets Department will be inspecting and trimming trees that are encroaching into the roadway. Our city ordinance has a standard on 12 feet over the back of curb, and 7 feet over sidewalk. Any branches that violate this clearance space are subject to removal by our crews. If any citizen prefers to do this themselves or hire someone else, that is acceptable. However, our Streets Department will be working to clear the encroaching branches and will not wait for property owners to complete this task.

Snow removal is to be expected during the month of December. Please comply with the winter parking ordinance. It is also helpful to remove any material/ personal property from the roadway.

FLIP THE STRIP

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Water utility bill credits will be available for participants. Please, watch the city's website northlogancity.org and social media for details in the coming months. Initially, this will be for commercial only, with residential to follow later.

STORMWATER

December is here and that means snow is coming. Here are a few reminders concerning snow and our storm drain system.

1. Do not pile snow on any storm drain and keep the snow out of the curb and gutter.
2. Keep your snow on your property and don't pile it in the streets.
3. Avoid overusing ice melt to keep pollutants out of the storm drain system.

A few other reminders:

1. Leaves are still falling. Our city truck is out and about sweeping gutters. Please assist us in keeping leaves away from drains. Thank you for all the efforts you've already made!
2. As much as possible, keep any mud on your property and clean up after yourself if a mess is made.
3. Avoid storing materials or trash cans and other objects on the road for long periods. This will assist us with plowing and sweeping, and will help ensure a functioning storm drain system.

Thank you for your efforts and cooperation to help ensure we have a clean city!

WATER

Protecting your home's backflow assembly helps North Logan keep our drinking water protected. A broken backflow assembly could allow backflows to happen, which could contaminate our water system. Now that cold weather has arrived, be sure to have your culinary irrigation lines blown out. This will help keep your backflow assembly from freezing and breaking. We also recommend insulating your backflow assembly as an added level of protection. Do your part to keep our water safe!

SEWER

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.
