Just as prices have risen for each of us in our individual households, North Logan City is not exempt to those same increases for goods and services. Because our expenses have increased significantly, the delicate act of balancing is even more complex this year.

While we continue to work towards different ways in increasing revenues, for example, hiring an official economic developer to drive future business; we also recognize that property tax rates also have to be considered to help off-set some of the burden. North Logan elected officials and city staff are committed to open, transparent dialogue around this process, along with keeping our property tax rate below average. Tentative budgets will be approved over the next few months, and we invite all to attend upcoming City Council meetings where these discussions will take place. Tax law is very complex and confusing; these meetings provide an opportunity to learn more about the process, and how your well-earned money is thoughtfully, and carefully spent in our city. The City Council Meetings this month will take place on Wednesdays, June 1st and 15th at 6:30 p.m. On June 1st, the City Council will be discussing the proposed municipal budget for FY 2023, which will include a public hearing regarding a potential property tax rate increase. There will also be a discussion regarding the proposed Smiling H Subdivision located at ~600E 2500N. The June 15th meeting may include a public hearing regarding the potential condemnation of a property located at ~1275E 2500N.


The Planning Commission Meetings this month will take place on Thursdays, June 2nd and 16th at 6:30 p.m. This month the Planning Commission will be updating the North Logan City Moderate Income Housing Plan, adopting the Active Transportation Plan, and discussing the Accessory Building Ordinance.

NORTH PARK POLICE

Citizens of North Logan and Hyde Park have expressed multiple concerns for safety and destruction of private property with the increased use of Off-Highway Vehicles. Our officers respond to multiple complaints and allow the circumstances to dictate the outcome of their interactions. Some of the complaints are surrounding speed, reckless driving, underage operation without the use of safety equipment, trespassing, etc. Officers may or may not issue a citation and/or impound the violator's Off-Highway Vehicle. The use of street-legal, off-highway vehicles is permitted under Utah Code **41-6a-1509** (<https://le.utah.gov/xcode/Title41/Chapter6a/41-6a-S1509.html>) within both North Logan and Hyde Park. Operation of off-highway vehicles is **NOT** allowed on any private property or trails without the consent of the property owner. There are no public trails in North Logan that allow motorized vehicle use. Therefore, there are *no* exceptions for unlicensed operation of any off-highway vehicle, motorcycle or golf cart on any city street, highway or public land not identified for off-highway vehicle use. Please ride responsibly and teach your children to do the same.

STORMWATER

It is finally warm enough to jump back into the pool! When you start the process of setting up your pool for the season, follow this link for a detailed explanation and examples on the proper way to dispose of old pool water <https://documents.deq.utah.gov/water-quality/factsheets/DWQ-2020-016428.pdf>.

When landscaping projects begin and material needs to be stored somewhere, people tend to stage it in the roadway and sidewalk. Not only is this a safety hazard, but a pollution hazard, as well. Instead, you should find a spot on your driveway, or locate the final area where your material will be, and store it there. Tarps are another great way to hold material on-site without causing, or potentially causing, pollution. Remember that the chemicals used or disposed of should not make it into a stormwater drain when washing or working on motorized vehicles. This month, you should see some of our employees out and about cleaning, fixing, and maintaining our retention and detention ponds. It is hard to know precisely where one property line ends, and another begins. If you see city employees working on or looking around for a retention pond, kindly point them in the right direction. If you have received a Pond Inspection Form, please fill this out as soon as possible for our records. Next month we will be out chip-sealing roadways. If you see mats in your inlet boxes, please leave those in place; they are to protect our waterways from the oils and rock used in the process of treating the road. Thank you all for your time and support, and please remember, we all live downstream!

STREETS

The Streets Department is beginning to do much more work out on the roads, as is typically done this time of year. We will be moving throughout the city with our street sweeper. Any vehicles on the road will be swept around, and we will not be able to get back to clean up any missed areas, due to the time it takes to cover all of North Logan.

We will also be crack sealing roads, painting intersections, cutting and patching asphalt, and working on damaged sidewalks. Please be aware and courteous to our employees as we try to do these services for the citizens of our city.

With the weather being good and yard work commencing please be mindful of storing landscape materials as well as tracking dirt and debris onto the roadway. These messes need to be cleaned up in a timely manner. Having material in the roadway places vehicles and citizens at risk. It also is detrimental to our storm infrastructure which can place citizens at risk of flooding. Let's keep North Logan looking good!

With summer right around the corner and your irrigation systems becoming active, have your backflow assembly tested to ensure they're working properly. Backflow assemblies help ensure that our drinking water is protected from potential contamination.

FLIP THE STRIP

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan City will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Water utility bill credits will be available for participants. Please, watch the City's website and social media for details in the coming month.

SEWER

To protect the Health, Safety and Finances of residents of North Logan City, we are issuing this PSA to inform you that the only item that is allowed to be put into the Sanitary Sewer System, aside from natural waste, is **toilet paper!** Please **DO NOT** flush items such as wipes (even "flushable" wipes, as they *do not* break down in the Sanitary Sewer System), feminine hygiene products, cleaning wipes, paper towels, trash, towels or cloth of any kind, diapers, grease, toys, Q-tips, or prescription and non-prescription drugs, etc. Please dispose of these products properly in solid waste/trash bins. Having the Sanitary Sewer System function properly, and maintaining the health of our community, are important to both North Logan City Administration and Staff.

Although the items that you may flush down the toilet escape your home's plumbing, the sewage blockages that occur in the subsequent, larger pipes affect many more people than just your family. Because the sewer services are a publicly-operated service, the cost to maintain that infrastructure is collected from sewer charges. Sewer back-ups in your home can cost a significant amount of money, as a Hazmat Cleanup service is needed to properly decontaminate the site.

WATER RESTRICTIONS NOTICE - June 2022

North Logan City Culinary Water Users

North Logan City has implemented water conservation measures. Culinary water users shall water **no more than TWO days per week**. Priority should be given to trees, shrubs or bushes, flowers, and gardens. Lawn watering should be considered a low priority. Overall landscape watering should be decreased by 30-40%. Please note that stricter water conservation measures will be implemented as the watering season continues. Please follow the address-based watering schedule below:

Requirements:

- **ODD addresses are permitted to water on Mondays & Fridays ONLY.**
(Example: 475 E 2500 N)
- **EVEN addresses are permitted to water on Tuesdays & Saturdays ONLY.**
(Example: 2076 N 1200 E)
- **NO WATERING on Sundays, Wednesdays & Thursdays.**
- **SECONDARY WATER USERS: Residences that utilize secondary water are prohibited from switching to culinary water for lawn watering for the entire watering season.**
- No excessive or wasteful watering.

Secondary (Canal) Water Users:

Please coordinate with your respective canal head gate/pipeline manager. Further information regarding secondary water restrictions can be found at cachehighline.com, or from the Hyde Park Irrigation Company (Twin Ditch Canal) (435) 881-3461.

Enforcement of these policies has begun. Letters of violation and fines will be issued to those not following the exterior watering schedule.

Definitions:

Culinary Water (City Water) is potable, treated, drinking water supplied to homes by the City. This water can be used throughout the home and exterior and is billed for by North Logan City.

Secondary Water (Canal Water) is non-potable, non-treated water supplied to much of the City by a canal or irrigation company, for purposes of landscape, crop, agriculture, or livestock watering. This water is not owned or managed by North Logan City. Restrictions on secondary water are set by the pipeline managers, which may vary from what North Logan City has set for restrictions. However, the vast majority of secondary users in North Logan are currently restricted to two days per week.

North Logan City is aware of which residents have secondary water on their property.
