

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

As of this writing, the state of Utah has officially tied the annual statewide record for snow water equivalent of 23.1 inches. This means by the time you receive the April newsletter, we will have almost certainly broken the record. What an astonishing change from the previous ten years. We are certainly fortunate for this water year, and the immediate water that will be available for secondary water this spring and summer. However, the precipitation that we are experiencing this winter will take two years to reach our aquifers, which is where we get our culinary water.

With that in mind, we realize that water will continue to be in high demand, and a limited resource. North Logan City is currently drilling a new well in Green Canyon, and we are also securing funding for a large amount of water storage in concrete reservoirs. These facility improvements should help the city to meet the increasing demand for water.

The more each of us does to help conserve, the better our long-term outlook. It might seem hard to believe, but we are close to hot days and dry weather. Sprinkler systems will start coming online, demand will increase. As a council, we encourage each resident to consider ways to help improve water efficiency. Some options include smart timers, rain sensors, conversion of grass mow strips, etc. If you have specific questions regarding ways you can help, we have a fantastic public works department that will be happy to take your call.

For many of us, this head start is a perfect opportunity to make changes on our properties that can benefit our entire community in the long run.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council will on meet once in April, on Wednesday, April 12th, at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. In April, the City Council will be considering a zoning text amendment regarding the RE-5 zone and how the base density can be calculated in a subdivision. There will also be department head budget proposals from the following departments: Library, Police, Facilities, General Government, Executive, Administrative, and the RDA.

The Planning Commission will only meet once in April, on Thursday, April 13th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public hearings or work session discussions on the following topics:

- ◆ An amendment to the subdivision access requirements and incentives to facilitate inner-block connectivity; and, ◆ An amendment to the existing Design Review structure and process for commercial, industrial, institutional, and City Center developments. Additional items may be discussed in April, depending on applications received throughout the month.

To stay informed on planning topics in the City, all Planning Commission and City Council agendas are published at least 24 hours in advance of any scheduled meetings on the Utah Public Notice website (utah.gov). Feel free to create an account on the utah.gov site and follow the North Logan City Council or Planning Commission to receive notifications of upcoming meetings. We also post our agendas on our website and on the North Logan City Facebook & Instagram pages prior to the meetings. STORMWATER

Lawn care season is here. Please follow the guidelines listed below for the best and cleanest results:

1. September is the best month to use fertilizer. When using fertilizer, use slow-release or time-release with soluble nitrogen.
2. Only fertilize once you have cut your grass a minimum of three times.
3. A common myth is that more is synonymous with better when discussing lawn health. That isn't always the case! One should only use two pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet. **Two pounds per 1,000 square feet** will yield the best results and save you money.
4. Leave grass clippings on the lawn to reduce the need for fertilizer and to promote a fuller and healthier lawn.
5. Spot-treat weeds when you can't handpick them, and don't douse the entire area.
6. If the forecast has rain or other wet weather, try not to spread or apply fertilizer and pesticides.
7. Sweep driveways and sidewalks rather than wash them with a hose.

Just to remind you, for your landscaping projects, please keep all stored materials off the road, and on your property. Having them on the road is a stormwater violation.

FLIP THE STRIP

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. GREEN WASTE

Logan City has given us notice that they will no longer be providing the green waste dumpsters at Elk Ridge Park. However, Logan City will continue to provide the curbside green waste can as an option this summer. In light of this new information, North Logan City will be providing a Spring Cleanup Program. On May 5th-6th, North Logan City will provide several dumpsters for both general refuse and green waste in the north parking lot of Elk Ridge Park. This service will be for North Logan City residents only (not for commercial or non-resident use), and will be free of charge for these two days.

STREETS

With spring approaching, our Streets Department is hoping to be about finished with the snow plowing. However, there could still be a storm out there for us to manage.

As the snows recede, we will begin street sweeping throughout the city. All of our gutters have debris, and we will cover every street. This could take some time, so please be patient as we make our way to your neighborhood.

Weather permitting, we will begin our routine maintenance of all city streets. This includes rebuilding the road shoulder, concrete repairs, crack seal, sign repair, etc. Along with these jobs, there is the potential to have roads closed for brief periods of time. We ask that you be mindful and respectful of road signage and find alternate routes if possible. Please be aware of our crews as they work to keep our city roads in good condition.

SEWER

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.

WATER - SUMMER OUTLOOK

North Logan's Water Outlook for Summer

This past winter has brought an abundance of snow to our mountains. Snowpack is expected to exceed ~150% of the yearly average. Despite the above-average snowfall and rain from this past winter, it will likely not be enough to alleviate our long-term drought conditions in North Logan. Snow runoff generally takes two years before it will replenish our aquifers, which is where we receive our culinary (city) water. It's still important to remain cautious and calculated about how we use water in North Logan this summer.

What to Expect:

Water Restrictions will remain in effect this summer. Water restrictions help tremendously in enabling us to meet the demand for water during the summer months. Water restrictions also help to promote water conservation by encouraging residences and businesses to be more mindful of their water usage.

North Logan has begun drilling and constructing our seventh well this winter. This new well is expected to expand our water production and help mitigate a portion of the growing demand of our city. In addition, over the next year, we will begin construction on more underground storage reservoirs, which will significantly aid in meeting the demands of culinary water.

New developments in North Logan are now permitted to utilize secondary (canal) water for exterior watering only, or in areas where extremely strict water restrictions are implemented.

Please try to postpone lawn watering (with city/culinary water) until **June 1st**. If you must, please abide by the odd/even address watering schedule below:

April's Water Restrictions:

Homes utilizing culinary (city) water for lawn watering are required to abide by the 3-days-per-week watering schedule:

ODD ADDRESSES: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays ONLY

EVEN ADDRESSES: Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays ONLY

No watering allowed on Sundays.

Properties that have access to culinary water and secondary water for lawn watering are required to use secondary water ONLY. Secondary water users will receive their schedule via their canal companies.

We appreciate your cooperation.
