MAYOR'S MESSAGE

You may or may not know that I've been talking trash for over a year now -- that is I've been representing North Logan in the formation and oversight of the Cache Waste Consortium. I haven't had such a garbage-filled vocabulary since herding cows on the family ranch in the '90s.

As we approach the October 1st projected start date for the switch from Logan City to Waste Management, look for more information in the city newsletter/social media/text message about how this change will affect you.

Most immediately, you'll see that the roll-off green waste bins (large dumpsters) near Elk Ridge Park will no longer be available. This is the result of a decision by Logan City to cease offering roll-off green waste bins, and will not affect your curbside green waste bins. North Logan will be hosting two Spring Clean-up days for our residents on May 5-6. The city will be renting several green waste and garbage dumpsters for you to drop off your yard waste on those days.

For residential curbside waste, your garbage service should look mostly the same. We'll be getting more information about days of service and future routes; but you can anticipate putting out your same recycling, green waste, and residential waste bins. North Logan City will continue to pass along information about the changeover as the start date approaches.

Until then, I'll attempt to clean up my language and to do everything I can to make this transition a smooth one.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings in May will take place on Wednesdays, May 3rd & 17th, at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The City Council will consider adopting a draft municipal budget for FY2024. There will be a consideration of a text amendment regarding the DSTM and interconnectivity in the City. The City Council will also consider a subdivision at the corner of 3100N 1200E, along with a discussion regarding filing dates for candidates for City Council.

The Planning Commission meetings in May will take place on Thursdays, May 4th & 18th, at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public hearings or work session discussions on the following topics: "Potential review and recommendation of the Preliminary Plat and Development Plan associated with the proposed Linden Lane Subdivision (~3100 N 1200 E); "Potential extension of a previously approved and currently expired Conditional Use Permit for a small, multi-unit storage project (~ 2000 N 200 W); "Additional review, and establishment on the record, of written findings of fact and conclusions of law associated with a previously denied Conditional Use Permit for a detached accessory dwelling unit (3270 N 1875 E); Work session discussion regarding a potential zoning text amendment to the city's zoning ordinance regarding Conditional Use Permits and detached accessory dwelling units; and, "Work session discussion regarding a potential zoning text amendment to the existing Design Review structure and process for commercial, industrial, institutional, and City Center developments. Additional items may be discussed in May, depending on applications received throughout the month.

NORTH PARK POLICE

With warmer weather, we are starting to see more bicyclists and motorcycle riders sharing the roadway.

A few days ago, I opened my email and read a complaint from a concerned citizen who described an encounter with a motorist, that happened on Wolfpack Way by Green Canyon High School. The driver of an older truck slowed down and yelled out obscenities at the bicyclist, and included a threat to run him over if he ever saw him again. This type of behavior threatens the safety and security of all citizens. In the interest of public safety, North Park Police would like to remind everyone about the following laws regarding bicycles and vehicles:

(41-6a-706.5) An operator of a motor vehicle <u>may not</u> knowingly, intentionally, or recklessly:

- (a) operate a motor vehicle within three feet of a vulnerable user of a highway;
- (b) distract or attempt to distract a vulnerable user of a highway for the purpose of causing violence or injury to the vulnerable user of a highway;
- (c) force or attempt to force a vulnerable user of a highway off the roadway for a purpose unrelated to public safety;

Motorists approaching a bicycle or moped rider <u>may</u> cross the centerline (41-6a-701) or the center two-way left turn lane (41-6a-710) to pass if it can be done safely.

As we demonstrate respect and patience on the roadways, our streets become safer. Lastly, the officers at North Park Police would like to thank the public for the incredible outpouring of support during the recent Walmart bomb hoax. FAQs

Below are a couple of timely questions asked about some current issues in our City, answered by Mayor Peterson:

What are the water restrictions going to look like this summer?

As Councilman Buzzy Mullahkhel pointed out, it will take our aquifers two years to recharge from past years of severe drought. As a result, North Logan City will continue to monitor our water supply throughout the summer. The good news is that well #5 has been drilled and will come online later this year.

We encourage residents to wait until June 1st to water. Culinary water users with odd addresses can water MWF and even addresses on T, Th, and Saturday.

What should I do to prepare for potential flooding?

Clean out rain gutters/drains. Place sandbags around window wells or walk-out basements. Sandbags are available to North Logan residents at city shops at 1650 N. 1100 E. Go to <u>floodhazards.utah.gov</u> for more information.

2023 NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION

North Logan City will hold its 2023 Municipal Election to elect three (3) City Council Members. City Council Members serve four-year terms and are elected at large. Election dates will be:

- Primary Election Tuesday, August 15, 2023 (if necessary)
- General Election Tuesday, November 7, 2023

The Incumbents are:

- Council Member: Buzzy Mullahkhel
- Council Member: Craig Humphreys
- Council Member: Roger T. Anderson

Those interested in filing for one of these offices must: Be a U.S Citizen at the time of filing; Be a registered voter of North Logan City; Be at least 18 years old; Be a resident of North Logan City for at least 365 days immediately preceding the date of the General Election (November 7, 2023); and, Not be a convicted felon.

Candidate Filing Period is from 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 1, 2023 and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 7, 2023, excluding Saturday and Sunday. Declaration of Candidacy Form or Nomination Petition must be filed in person at the North Logan City Recorder's Office located at 2076 North 1200 East, North Logan, UT. There is no filing fee. Candidates are subject to financial disclosure requirements identified in UCA 10-3-208.

STREETS

For the month of May, we will have some warm weather that will allow us to get out and begin maintenance work on the roads. This will include sweeping, crack sealing, road shouldering, painting, patching, etc. All of these jobs are necessary to preserve our roads, as well as prepare the asphalt for surface treatments.

Our street sweeper has been busy in between snow storms, and is now free to continue sweeping with decent weather ahead. We will work our way throughout the city clearing debris from gutters for spring cleanup.

This winter was very hard on our streets. As a result, we have been busy filling potholes that have opened up because of extreme moisture and cold. If you see an existing pothole, please let us know so that we can get these taken care of. (You can go to our website at <u>northlogancity.org</u> and go to the tab at the top that says *I WANT TO...*, and then *go to REPORT A PROBLEM*, and then to *STREETS WORK ORDER* and fill out the form; or you call our office at (435) 752-1310 x10 to let our Receptionist know.)

Our tree trimming is winding down as spring begins. We may still hit a few random areas that pop onto our radar due to encroachment into roadways and sidewalks.

Beginning the week of June 12th, North Logan will surface-treat several roads in order to keep them sealed up. This will be on 1800/1900 N from Main St. to Green Canyon; 2200/2300 N from 200 E to 1600 E; Canyon Ridge Subdivision south of 3100 N; and, Green Canyon Neighborhoods/2450 N/2600 N, all above 600 E. Further information will be coming in the following weeks. Please have this on your radar as it will require road closures. Thanks!

WATER - SUMMER OUTLOOK

North Logan's Water Outlook for Summer

This past winter has brought an abundance of snow to our mountains. Snowpack is expected to exceed ~150% of the yearly average. Despite the above-average snowfall and rain from this past winter, it will likely not be enough to alleviate our long-term drought conditions in North Logan. Snow runoff generally takes about two years before it replenishes our underground aquifers, which is where we receive our culinary water. It's still important to remain cautious and calculated about how we use water in North Logan this summer.

What to Expect:

Water Restrictions will remain in effect this summer. Water restrictions help tremendously in enabling us to meet the growing demand for water during the summer months. Water restrictions also help to promote water conservation by encouraging residences and businesses to be more mindful of their water usage.

North Logan has begun drilling and constructing our 7th well this past winter. This new well is expected to expand our water production and help mitigate a portion of the growing demand of our city. In addition, over the next year we will begin construction on more underground storage reservoirs, which will significantly aid in meeting the demands of culinary water.

New developments in North Logan are now only permitted to utilize secondary (canal water) for exterior watering, or in areas where extremely strict water restrictions are implemented.

Please strive to postpone lawn watering until **June 1st**, if possible. If you must water, please abide by the address watering schedule below:

May's Water Restrictions:

Homes utilizing culinary (city) water for lawn watering are required to abide by the <u>3 days per week</u> watering schedule as follows:

ODD ADDRESSES: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays

EVEN ADDRESSES: Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays

No watering allowed on Sundays.

Properties that have access to culinary water and secondary water for lawn watering are required to use <u>secondary water ONLY</u>. Secondary water users will receive their schedule via their canal companies.

Flip the Strip:

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Water utility bill credits will be available for participants. Please, watch the city's website at <u>northlogancity.org</u> and social media for details in the coming months. Initially, this will be for commercial only, with residential to follow later.
