GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings in June will take place on Wednesdays, June 7th & 21st, at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. In June, the City Council will hold public hearings regarding end of year revisions to this year's budget, and the proposed budget for next fiscal year (starting July 1, 2023). There will be a public hearing regarding an application to the Community Impact Board for a potential grant to help fund culinary water studies. In addition, the City Council will consider a proposed plat amendment for the North Logan Industrial Subdivision (400W 2850N).

The Planning Commission meetings in June will take place on Thursdays, June 8th & 22nd, at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public hearings or work session discussions on the following topics:
◆Potential review and recommendation of the Preliminary Plat and Development Plan associated with the proposed Linden Lane Subdivision (~3100 N 1200 E); ◆Potential extension of a previously approved and currently-expired Conditional Use Permit for a small, multi-unit storage project (~2000 N 200 W): ◆Work session

multi-unit storage project (~2000 N 200 W); ♦ Work session discussions and potential public hearing and recommendation regarding a zoning text amendment to the city's zoning ordinance regarding conditional use permits and detached accessory dwelling units; ♦ Review and recommendation regarding a proposed development plan for a mixed commercial project located at approximately 2200 N 100 E in the City Center Commercial (CCC) zone. Additional items may be discussed in June, depending on applications received throughout the month.

To stay informed on planning topics in the City, all City Council and Planning Commission agendas are published at least 24 hours in advance of any scheduled meetings on the Utah Public Notice website (utah.gov). Feel free to create an account on the utah.gov site and follow the North Logan City Council or Planning Comm. to receive notifications of upcoming meetings. 2023 NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION

North Logan City will hold its 2023 Municipal Election to elect three (3) City Council Members. City Council Members serve four-year terms and are elected at large. Election dates will be:

- Primary Election Tuesday, August 15, 2023 (if necessary)
- General Election Tuesday, November 7, 2023

The Incumbents are:

- Council Member: Buzzy Mullahkhel
- Council Member: Craig Humphreys
- Council Member: Roger T. Anderson

Those interested in filing for one of these offices must: Be a U.S Citizen at the time of filing; Be a registered voter of North Logan City; Be at least 18 years old; Be a resident of North Logan City for at least 365 days immediately preceding the date of the General Election (November 7, 2023); and, Not be a convicted felon.

Candidate Filing Period is from 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 1, 2023, and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 7, 2023, excluding Saturday and Sunday. Declaration of Candidacy Form or Nomination Petition must be filed in person at the North Logan City Recorder's Office located at 2076 North 1200 East, North Logan, UT. There is no filing fee. Candidates are subject to financial disclosure requirements identified in UCA 10-3-208.

STREETS

The Streets Department will be preparing several North Logan roads for surface treatments that are taking place this year.

During the week of June 12th-16th we will be fog-sealing:

- 1800 N from Main St. to 1000 E
- 1900 N from 1000 E to King Park
- 2200 N from 200 E to 1200 E
- 2300 N from 1200 E to 1600 E
- All of the Green Canyon neighborhoods south of 1900 N
- All of the Canyon Ridge neighborhoods south of 3100 N
- 2450 N off of 1600 E

Road closures should be expected and traffic will **NOT** be permitted on these streets until the applied product has dried. This usually takes about an hour. Individuals who disregard this instruction, risk damage their vehicles and failure of the product being applied.

Until June 12th, we will be patching several failed spots in the roads. Please be respectful of our signs and crews. These signs and road closures are there for the safety of our citizens, and crews. Closures also ensure that these repairs are not damaged by traffic being reintroduced too soon.

Our work will continue throughout June to prepare for additional surface treatments, scheduled to occur on the week of July 10th. These surface treatments will be applied on 1600 E, and 800 E. Road closures will take place, and traffic will **NOT** be permitted on sections of these roads for up to 2 hours.

STORMWATER

With the weather warming up, it's time to jump back into the pool! When you start the process of setting your pool up for the season, follow this link for a detailed explanation and examples of the proper way to dispose of old pool water https://documents.deq.utah.gov/water-quality/fact-sheets/DWQ-2020-016428.pdf.

Please watch for hazardous materials entering the storm drain. Remember to keep all chemicals, oils, and other hazardous materials contained. If they spill, clean them up quickly. Avoid cleaning with water. While working on cars or other motorized equipment, catch all drained fluids into a catch-pan and dispose of them properly. If spills occur, use the Floor-Dry product to soak up spilled fluids, and dispose of them properly. Following these procedures will help to keep harmful pollutants out of the storm drain system. We appreciate your efforts.

This month the city will send letters to landowners with retention or detention ponds. If you receive this letter, please perform the inspection and return it to the city. City employees will also be performing inspections on ponds. While we will do our best to stay off your property, please have patience and talk with the employees. We will work with you to make this as painless as possible. Thanks for all your cooperation!

WATER - SUMMER OUTLOOK

North Logan's Water Outlook for Summer

This past winter has brought an abundance of snow to our mountains. Snowpack is expected to exceed ~150% of the yearly average. Despite the above-average snowfall and rain from this past winter, it will likely not be enough to alleviate our long-term drought conditions in North Logan. Snow runoff generally takes about two years before it replenishes our underground aquifers, which is where we receive our culinary water. It's still important to remain cautious and calculated about how we use water in North Logan this summer.

What to Expect:

Water Restrictions will remain in effect this summer. Water restrictions help tremendously in enabling us to meet the growing demand for water during the summer months. Water restrictions also help to promote water conservation by encouraging residences and businesses to be more mindful of their water usage. By implementing a watering restriction schedule, North Logan can effectively cut water demand in half, ensuring that the daily summer water demand is met.

North Logan has begun drilling and constructing our 7th well this past winter. This new well is expected to expand our water production and help mitigate a portion of the growing demand of our city. In addition, over the next year we will begin construction on more underground storage reservoirs, which will significantly aid in meeting the demands of culinary water.

New developments in North Logan are now only permitted to utilize secondary (canal water) for exterior watering, or in areas where extremely strict water restrictions are implemented.

Please strive to postpone lawn watering until **June 1**st, if possible. If you must water, please abide by the address watering schedule below:

June's Water Restrictions:

Homes utilizing culinary (city) water for lawn watering are required to abide by the <u>3 days per week</u> watering schedule as follows:

ODD ADDRESSES: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays
EVEN ADDRESSES: Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays
No watering allowed on Sundays.

Properties that have access to culinary water and secondary water for lawn watering are required to use <u>secondary water ONLY</u>. Secondary water users will receive their schedule via their canal companies.

Flip the Strip:

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Water utility bill credits will be available for participants. Please, watch the city's website at northlogancity.org and social media for details in the coming months. Initially, this will be for commercial only, with residential to follow later.
