GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings in August will take place on Wednesdays, Aug. 2nd & 16th, at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library In August , the City Council will be considering proposed code changes for landscaping requirements for new developments which will enable the city to be eligible for the state's landscape conversion incentive program. There will also be a development plan and preliminary plat consideration for an 8 lot subdivision on the corners (NW & SW) of 3100N 1200E, along with a single lot subdivision at 2600N 1600E.

The Planning Commission meetings in August will take place on Thursdays, Aug. 3rd & 17th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public hearings or work session discussions on the following topics:

- ◆Development plan and preliminary plat for a single-lot subdivision located at approximately 2600 North and 1600 East; ◆An amendment to the North Cache Business Park Subdivision located at 2500 North and 500 West; ◆Development plan for a mixed-use commercial project located at approximately 2200 N 100 E;
- ♦ Rezone request for a portion of Parcel ID: 04-084-0021 from small single-family residential (SF6) to City Center Adjacent (CCA);
- ◆Amendments to the regulations for Accessory Dwelling Units, Short-Term Rentals, and Conditional Use Permits; ◆Amendments to the regulations for on-site waste water systems (septic) for new dwellings not serviced by sewer.

Additional items may be discussed in August, depending on applications received throughout the month.

language that portrays a sense of urgency or pressure. These types of scams sometimes resemble a check with the words "Registration Fee Voucher" somewhere on it. If it sounds too good to be true, it more than likely is!

Our detectives have put together a fraud presentation to help with this problem, and are more than willing to come present to your group or organization. MAYOR'S FAQ

Below are some frequently asked questions pertaining to your utility bills:

Why do I still see a 50-cent charge on my utility bill for green waste?

Logan has always charged \$1.00 per month for green waste--50 cents of which went towards having the green waste containers at Elk Ridge; and the remaining 50 cents was for composting at the landfill (for curbside or direct haul green waste). Because they continue to provide the composting, they continue to charge the 50-cent fee.

When will garbage service in North Logan transition from Logan City to Waste Management? October 1, 2023.

Will we still have recycling and curbside green waste service?

Yes. Those services will continue when Waste Management begins service.

I got my property tax bill from the County. Why am I still being billed for the Hyde Park Cemetery Maintenance District?

In March of this year, we were thrilled to finish the lengthy process to adjust the cemetery district boundaries. However, this change won't take effect until 2024. The good news is that this will be your last time ever paying into the HPCMD as a North Logan resident.

STORMWATER

Here are a few reminders on small steps you can take to help keep our city and water clean:

- Try and wash your car in designated car wash areas. They are designed with containment structures, keeping pollutants out of storm drains.
- If you have septic tanks, remember to have them cleaned and inspected.
 Doing so will greatly reduce the chance of pollutants spilling into water ways.
- If you are doing landscaping projects, please store materials on your property and not the shoulder of the road.

COMPLAINTS, CONCERNS, FEEDBACK?

If you go to the city's website at northlogancity.org and click on the "I want to" tab, you will be given an option to "Report a Problem." GARBAGE

GREEN WASTE FEE: North Logan is currently working with Logan City regarding the additional fee that was being charged for the Green Waste Dumpsters that used to be at Elk Ridge Park. You should start seeing slight reductions in your garbage bill this month, as this service is no longer provided by Logan City.

WATER

North Logan City would like to thank our residents and businesses for following the water restrictions this summer. You have all helped to make a *huge* difference, and we are grateful!

In addition, North Logan City has made impressive strides in curbing our consumption of potable water by embracing a range of innovative measures; primarily focusing on the utilization of secondary water sources and private wells to irrigate various city parks and properties. Prominent green spaces like Elk Ridge Park and the Cache Recreation Complex now rely on secondary water for their lawn watering needs, exemplifying the city's commitment to water conservation. Even essential facilities like the City Offices, Police Station, and Fire Station have successfully transitioned to using secondary water sources only. Notably, the city has been actively working on converting our cemetery away from using culinary water sources, and it is soon to be irrigated by a secondary water supply, demonstrating our effort to further reduce our impact on potable water resources. These concerted endeavors serve as a testament to North Logan City's dedication to responsible water management practices, all while adhering to water allocations mandated by canal companies.

August Water Restrictions:

Homes utilizing culinary (city) water for lawn watering are required to abide by the <u>3 days</u> per week watering schedule as follows:

ODD ADDRESSES: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays EVEN ADDRESSES: Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays No watering allowed on Sundays

Properties that have access to culinary (city) water and secondary (canal) water for lawn watering are <u>required</u> to use <u>secondary water ONLY</u>. Secondary water users will receive their schedule via their canal companies.

Flip the Strip:

As part of our water conservation strategy, North Logan will be implementing incentives to swap out the grass in your park strip and replace it with waterwise landscaping. Water utility bill credits will be available for participants. Please watch the city's website at northlogancity.org and social media for details in the coming months. Initially, this will be for commercial only, with residential to follow later.

BMX TRACK at ELK RIDGE PARK

North Logan is having issues with people using motorized vehicles on the BMX track at Elk Ridge Park. This will not only destroy the track; but the damage caused also makes it extremely unsafe for the riders of all ages who enjoy using this awesome feature, which we have made free to the citizens. If you could consider the following information, for the safety and enjoyment for all, we would greatly appreciate it. We want to ensure that the track will remain, and continue to be something that all can enjoy!



- BMX tracks are designed specifically for non-motorized bicycles only, and allowing motorized vehicles can cause damage to the track surface, which can make it unsafe for riders, and compromises the integrity of the track, and the sport.
- Only non-motorized pedal bicycles are permitted on the track, along with Class I E-Bikes.
- Track Preservation: BMX tracks are typically made of clay or dirt surfaces, which can become easily damaged when wet. Riding on a damp track can lead to ruts, erosion, and uneven surfaces, making it unsafe and less enjoyable for riders. Closing the track during the rain helps to preserve its integrity and prolong its lifespan.
