

**MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

We are embarking on yet another election season and will be filling three City Council seats in November. One of the best parts of North Logan City government is that our city roles are nonpartisan, which is a breath of fresh air from some of the national issues that are constantly in the news. Speaking personally, it's difficult to file and run for public office, so we applaud those willing to serve our community in this way.

Here are some questions that I have found helpful when I'm researching candidates:

*What do I know about the candidate? Do they have a good command of the issues facing our city? Is this person willing to listen and learn? Who are their major supporters/advisors/influences? What are their biases?*

*How does the candidate conduct their campaign? Do they treat opponents with respect? How willing are they to accept responsibility?*

*Do they promise things they don't/won't have authority over? Think back to middle school years when SBO candidates would promise homework bans or free Twinkies in the lunchroom if you cast your vote for them. We see some of those kinds of promises today.*

This is just a place to start, of course, and we'll have a chance to get to know the six candidates that make it through the primary election at our Meet the Candidate Night on Thursday, September 28<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m. (Q&A begins at 6:00 p.m.) I encourage you to make every effort to be there so you can get more information from the candidates on issues that affect our community, and ask them any questions that will help you make an informed decision. These elections have a huge impact on our city's future and I'm imploring you to not let frustration, indifference, confusion, or exhaustion prevent you from participating in the political process.

**The City Council will only meet once in September on Wednesday, Sept. 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library.** In September, the City Council will hold a public hearing to receive input regarding a proposed mixed-use development concept plan at ~ 2200N 100E. There will also be potential updates to the nuisance ordinance, and private firework ordinance.

**The Planning Commission will only meet once in September on Thursday, Sept. 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library.** The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold regular meetings or work session discussions on the following topics:

- ◆ Development plan and preliminary plat for a single-lot subdivision located at approximately 2600 North and 1600 East;
- ◆ An amendment to the North Cache Business Park Subdivision located at 2500 North and 500 West; ◆ Amendments to the regulations for Accessory Dwelling Units, Short-Term Rentals, and Conditional Use Permits; ◆ Amendments to the regulations for on-site waste water systems (septic) for new dwellings not serviced by sewer.

Additional items may be discussed in September, depending on applications received throughout the month.

**NORTH PARK POLICE**

Welcome back students! As school starts up again, North Park Police would like to bring to your attention the safety rules regarding school crosswalks. Many of our students bike or walk to school and use the crosswalks daily. Please remember:

**41-6a-1002: Pedestrians' right-of-way.**

1. The operator of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way by slowing down or stopping if necessary:
  - a. To a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is on the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling; or
  - b. When the pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in danger.
2. The operator of a vehicle approaching a school crosswalk shall come to a complete stop at the school crosswalk if the crosswalk is occupied by a person.
3. If a vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk or at any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection to permit a pedestrian to cross the roadway, the operator of any other vehicle approaching from the rear may not overtake and pass the stopped vehicle.

Please follow the directions of our crossing guards. Our crossing guards play a critical role in helping our students remain safe as they walk or bike to school. The biggest threat to our students and crossing guards is from vehicles turning left or right. If you are in a hurry, consider taking an alternate route and avoiding the crosswalks at the start and end of school.

## MAYOR'S FAQ

Below are some frequently asked questions pertaining to garbage services:



### **Who is included in the Cache Waste Consortium (CWC) service agreement?**

Residents and businesses in the following cities/towns are included in the CWC service agreement: Amalga, Clarkston, Hyde Park, Hyrum, Mendon, Millville, Newton, Nibley, North Logan, Paradise, River Heights, Trenton, Wellsville and Unincorporated Cache County areas.

### **When is Commercial service starting?**

Commercial waste service is starting in a phased approach. The first customers were notified of service starting July 31<sup>st</sup>. All commercial customers in the CWC service area will transition to WM (Waste Management) service by October 1, 2023. WM will send a postcard to the company billing address to notify the business of the start date for WM service.

### **When is Residential service starting?**

Residential waste collection service will begin October 1, 2023.

### **Will my schedule change?**

WM is evaluating the current routes and will update residents of their collection dates via a mailer in mid-September.

- ◆ Trash will be collected once per week.
- ◆ Recyclables will be collected once every two weeks. WM will collect clean plastic bottles, milk jugs, tin and aluminum cans, paper and cardboard.
- ◆ In North Logan, residential green waste will be collected every other week through October 31, 2023.

### **Will I get a new can (bin)?**

Your current containers will be purchased from Logan City and will be owned by WM. As WM starts service, you will continue to use the same containers.

### **Who will bill Residential customers for service?**

For residential service, individual cities will continue to bill their residents as part of their monthly utility bill. WM will bill the individual cities.

### **Who can I contact for more information?**

Commercial customers can contact WM at 800-796-9696 with questions about their service. Please be sure to indicate you are located in Cache County (or indicate your specific city). Residential customers should call their cities/towns.

## STREETS

For the month of September, our Streets Department will be working hard to get several city streets crack-sealed. The oil used to do this sets up after just a few minutes. However, in that short time before, it is important for traffic not to drive through this material. If that happens, the oil will stick to tires, etc. as well as be pulled off of the road. Our crews will be closing travel lanes and setting up traffic cones around the areas that they are working. We appreciate your patience and cooperation!

## STORMWATER

Here are some helpful tips about lawn care. September is the ideal time to apply fertilizer. Follow the tips below and make sure to keep lawn clippings and fertilizer out of the gutters.

1. A common myth is that more is synonymous with better when discussing lawn health. That isn't always the case! Someone should only use two pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet. Implementing this practice will give you the best results and save you money.
2. Leave grass clippings on the lawn to reduce the need for fertilizer and promote a more full and healthy lawn.
3. Spot treat weeds when you can't handpick them, and don't douse the entire area.
4. Watch for the weather ahead and don't apply fertilizers or pesticides when rain or other weather events are forecast for the immediate future.
5. Sweep driveways and sidewalks rather than wash with a hose.

## WATER

North Logan City would like to thank our residents and businesses for following the water restrictions this summer. You have all helped to make a *huge* difference, and we are grateful!

In addition, North Logan City has made impressive strides in curbing our consumption of potable water by embracing a range of innovative measures; primarily focusing on the utilization of secondary water sources and private wells to irrigate various city parks and properties. Prominent green spaces like Elk Ridge Park and the Cache Recreation Complex now rely on secondary water for their lawn watering needs, exemplifying the city's commitment to water conservation. Even essential facilities like the City Offices, Police Station, and Fire Station have successfully transitioned to using secondary water sources only. The grounds of the new North Logan City Offices will be planned using water-wise landscaping. Notably, the city has been actively working on converting our cemetery away from using culinary water sources, and it is soon to be irrigated by a secondary water supply, demonstrating our effort to further reduce our impact on potable water resources. These concerted endeavors serve as a testament to North Logan City's dedication to responsible water management practices, all while adhering to water allocations mandated by canal companies.

### September Water Restrictions:

Homes utilizing culinary (city) water for lawn watering are required to abide by the 3 days per week watering schedule as follows:

**ODD ADDRESSES: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays**

**EVEN ADDRESSES: Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays**

**No watering allowed on Sundays**

Properties that have access to culinary (city) water and secondary (canal) water for lawn watering are required to use **secondary water ONLY**. Secondary water users will receive their schedule via their canal companies.

### Landscape Rebate Program:

We are pleased to announce that North Logan City is now eligible for the State's (DNR) landscape rebate program. This program provides incentives and rebates for residents and businesses who install certain types of water-wise landscaping on their property, including park strips. ## BMX TRACK at ELK RIDGE PARK

North Logan is having issues with people using motorized vehicles on the BMX track at Elk Ridge Park. This will not only destroy the track; but the damage caused also makes it extremely unsafe for the riders of all ages who enjoy using this awesome feature, which we have made free to the citizens. If you could consider the following information, for the safety and enjoyment for all, we would greatly appreciate it. We want to ensure that the track will remain, and continue to be something that all can enjoy!



- BMX tracks are designed specifically for non-motorized bicycles only, and allowing motorized vehicles can cause damage to the track surface, which can make it unsafe for riders, and compromises the integrity of the track, and the sport.
- Only non-motorized pedal bicycles are permitted on the track, along with Class I E-Bikes.
- Track Preservation: BMX tracks are typically made of clay or dirt surfaces, which can become easily damaged when wet. Riding on a damp track can lead to ruts, erosion, and uneven surfaces, making it unsafe and less enjoyable for riders. Closing the track during the rain helps to preserve its integrity and prolong its lifespan.
