**GOVERNMENT MEETINGS** (Agendas: [pmn.utah.gov](http://pmn.utah.gov))

**The City Council meetings this month will take place on Wednesdays, October 4<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m.** In October, the City Council will be considering changes to the Master Fee Schedule related to fireworks displays, solid waste (garbage), and developmental/land use fees. The City Council will also consider changes to the code related to Accessory Dwelling Units and Short Term Rentals, along with a consideration of a selection of the firm to help rewrite the City's General Plan.

**The Planning Commission meetings in October will take place on Thursdays, October 5<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library.** The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public meetings regarding the following topics:

- ♦Amendments to the Subdivision Ordinance required to comply with SB 174;
- ♦Amendment to the North Cache Business Park Subdivision located at 2500 North and 500 West; and,
- ♦Amendments to the regulations for on-site waste water systems (septic) for new dwellings not serviced by sewer.

**NORTH PARK POLICE**

As Chief of Police, I want to take the opportunity to update citizens on a change regarding how North Park Police Department officers will handle calls for vehicle lockouts starting in October. Currently, our officers are responding anytime a citizen calls for help by unlocking their vehicles doors. Citizens have been asked to sign a liability waiver in case of possible damage that might occur when the officer attempts to unlock the vehicle. With newer vehicles and updated anti-theft technology, the potential of damaging the vehicle's electronic control system is very real, and could be very costly. Unless a vulnerable person or an animal is inside the vehicle, the request for lockout assistance falls to a lower priority with other calls for service, and an officer is sometimes delayed for more than an hour before they can respond. Most times, citizens understand the delay in receiving help, but the frustration is still there.

In an effort to be most efficient with our limited resources, starting October 1, 2023, North Park Police Department officers will only respond to lockout requests if a vulnerable person or animal is locked inside the car. Citizens requiring help with a lockout under any other circumstance will need to contact a locksmith or their insurance company to request assistance. We appreciate the public's support and understanding as we try to make best use of the resources available in our service to you.

The department also has need of a crossing guard for Cedar Ridge Elementary School during the morning and afternoon. If you are interested, please fill out an application from our website (at [www.northparkpolice.org](http://www.northparkpolice.org) under the forms section) and bring it in. If you have any questions or concerns, feel free to contact the Police Department during our normal business hours or call us at 435-753-7600.

Whorton and Orel Kay Allen have been married for 70 years. Our crews will be closing travel lanes and setting up traffic cone around the areas that they are working. We appreciate your patience and cooperation!

With fall here, leaves will be falling. City workers will be sweeping the streets constantly in an attempt to keep up. You can do your part by keeping your leaves on your own property and not sweeping or blowing them into the street. Dumping leaves into a ditch or drainage swale is also a stormwater violation. Sweeping out the gutter in front of your house would greatly help us and be much appreciated.

With bad weather coming, please help reduce the mess by cleaning up and keeping materials on your property-store materials for final landscaping projects on your property, not in the road or gutter. Thank you for doing your part to keep North Logan City clean!

## WATER METER LIDS

Please make sure that the North Logan City water meter lids on your property remain clear of obstructions or landscaping to allow for emergency access as well as maintenance of the water meters. Also, please be careful of the new water lids that have antennas that have been getting broken by mowing and other causes. Thank you!

## WATER

As the summer season winds down and the days grow a bit cooler, we want to extend our gratitude to every resident for your commitment to responsible water usage during this summer watering season. Many residents continued with the momentum from last year's reduction in water usage. Your efforts have not gone unnoticed.

We also want to commend our local business owners for their proactive measures in conserving water. Many businesses and institutions made great strides to cut exterior water usage altogether, opting to utilize secondary water sources instead.

Your diligent water-saving practices have made a real difference. Whether it was reducing outdoor watering, fixing leaks promptly, or simply being mindful of water consumption, your actions have contributed to healthy water usage amounts. Despite a more relaxed watering restriction schedule this year, we're happy to report that we have only seen a minimal **2.4%** increase in water usage from April - August 2023 as compared to the same period in 2022. Here is a look at the numbers:
