GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The one City Council meeting this month will take place on Wednesday, December 13th at 6:30 p.m. In December, the City Council will hear an annual financial audit report for FY2023. In addition, there may be a discussion and possible consideration of a Special Permit for a new proposed Rocky Mountain Power substation near 100E 1950N.

The Planning Commission will only meet once in December on Thursday, December 14th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public meetings and discussions on the following topics:

◆Amendments to the Subdivision Ordinance required to comply

with SB 174; ◆Amendments to the North Cache Business Park Subdivision (500 W 2500 N); ◆Amendments to Lot 37 of the Wildercrest Phase 2A Subdivision (2638 N 2300 E); ◆Review of a developer-proposed development agreement for the Smiling H Phase 1 and Phase 2 Subdivision to modify specific setback requirements.

NORTH PARK POLICE

Ready or not, winter is here to stay. When the snow flies, our city snowplow drivers are hindered in their ability to quickly remove the snow from the roads when cars are parked illegally on the street. Please remember:

Winter parking restrictions are in effect. Please be sure to have your vehicles off the streets so the plow drivers can keep the roads clear of snow this winter. North Park Police officers will be issuing citations if you are in violation of the following code:

11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking Prohibited No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of midnight (12:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day, beginning November 1st and ending March 31st, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.

STREETS

We ask you to please keep in mind, that when snow is forecast, it is helpful when our citizens remove vehicles, trailers, garbage cans, etc. from the roadway. SNOW PLOWING ON CHRISTMAS DAY

Special thanks to the fastest, and most amazing snow plow crew in the world. We believe they deserve a break to be with their families. So, if we have a white Christmas, the plow crew will not start at their normal hour of 4 a.m. Instead they will start plowing around Noon on Christmas day.

STORMWATER

December is here and that means snow is coming. Here are a few reminders concerning snow and our storm drain system:

- 1. Do not pile snow on any storm drain, and keep the snow out of the curb and gutter.
- 2. Keep your snow on your property and don't pile it in the streets.
- 3. Avoid overusing ice melt to keep pollutants out of the storm drain system.

A few other reminders:

- 1. Leaves are still falling. Our city truck is out and about sweeping gutters. Please assist us in keeping leaves away from drains. Thanks for all your efforts already made.
- 2. As much as possible, keep any mud on your property and clean up after yourself if a mess is made.
- 3. Avoid storing materials or trash cans and other objects on the road for long periods. This will assist us with plowing and sweeping, and will help ensure a functioning storm drain system.

CITIZEN INPUT NEEDED! LEAD REDUCTION PROGRAM

The Environmental Protection Agency is requiring a full inventory of the water service line types for all properties in Utah, North Logan City included.

There are four primary service line/pipe materials types, which are shown below. North Logan City is largely certain that we do not have any lead service lines. We are required, however, to verify this information, and we need your help in identifying your home's water service line type. We need everyone's input! To aid in helping you identify your home's service line material type, please follow the following steps:

How to Identify Your Service Line Type:

Step 1: Locate where your service line enters your home. This is normally located in a utility or hot water heater room.

Step 2: Locate the test area. Find the water shut off valve and/or pressure reducer valve (PRV). The test area is located between the shutoff valve and the floor or exterior wall.

Step 3: The material type can be identified through a visual inspection, a scratch test, or magnet test. In some cases, the pipe can clearly be identified as plastic or copper. In other cases, due to corrosion, the pipe needs



to be scratched to reveal a copper penny color, or silver color. If it is a silver color the only way to determine between galvanized or lead is a magnet test. Magnets will stick to galvanized but will not stick to lead.

Step 4: Take a picture of your test area, then submit your findings through the survey link.

WATER

Protecting your home's backflow assembly helps North Logan keep our drinking water protected. A broken backflow assembly could allow backflows to happen, which could contaminate our water system. Now that cold weather has arrived, be sure to have your culinary irrigation lines blown out. This will help keep your backflow assembly from freezing and breaking. We also recommend insulating your backflow assembly as an added level of protection.



MAYOR'S FAQ - City Rentals

- Q: Can I long-term rent a dwelling I own in North Logan?
 - A: Yes! Any dwelling in North Logan can be offered for long-term rental (30 days +).
- Q: Can I short-term rent a dwelling I own in North Logan?
 - A: Yes!* But first you must obtain a Conditional Use Permit through the Planning Commission.
- Q: Am I allowed to create a separate apartment or living quarters on my property for rental purposes?
 - A: Yes.* Contact our Community Development Director to find out the requirements for creating your specific Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU).
- Q: If a property that I own has an ADU (attached or detached), can I long-term or short-term rent the primary dwelling to one tenant, and long-term or shortterm rent the accessory dwelling unit to another tenant?
 - A: No. Single-family properties with an ADU must remain owner-occupied (i.e., the owner must live in either the primary dwelling or the ADU).
- Q: How many people can occupy a rental property?
 - ◆ Long-term rentals: a single family (related by blood, marriage, or adoption) +1 unrelated individual; or, 4 unrelated
 - ♦ Short-term rental: two people per bedroom + 4 additional individuals.**
- Q: Can I allow someone to reside in an RV or camp trailer on my property?

- Conditions apply. Contact the North Logan Community Development Department for more information.
- ** May also be further restricted based on available parking.
