GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings this month will take place on Wednesdays, November 1st and 15th at 6:30 p.m. In November, the City Council will consider updates to the Master Fee Schedule related to encroachment fees, along with a concept plan for single lot subdivision at approximately 1285E 1500N. This City Council may also discuss city entrance signage, fiber networks, and a potential special permit for Rocky Mountain Power.

The Planning Commission meetings in November will take place on Thursdays, November 2nd & 16th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public meetings and work session discussions on the following topics: ♦Review of the Preliminary Plat and Development Plan for the Nash Subdivision (~1285E 1500N); ♦Amendments to the Subdivision Ordinance required to comply with SB 174; ♦Amendment to the North Cache Business Park Subdivision located at 2500 North and 500 West; ♦Amendments to the regulations for on-site waste-water systems (septic) for new dwellings not serviced by sewer.

NORTH PARK POLICE

Recently, there have been several vehicle thefts and reports of items being taken from cars. In almost every report, our officers have found that car doors were left unlocked and the keys to the vehicle were inside the car. Criminals capitalize, and look for crimes of opportunity when doors and windows are left unlocked, purses are left in shopping carts while customers browse, and expensive equipment is left unattended. Protect your loved ones by locking your vehicle and home doors, making sure the exterior lights of your home are working, and closing garage doors at night. Stay alert and use good judgement by taking the time to notice your surroundings.

In addition, the Police Department has taken several reports of public property being vandalized at our parks. If you or a family member notices something out of place or that doesn't feel right, please call Dispatch at 435-753-7555 as soon as you can. We are asking for the community's help as we try to curb this problem. Our officers can respond quickly, and it gives the police a better chance of identifying potential suspects. Our combined efforts as citizens and officers working together can help make our city safer.

Allen and Kay Kartchner

Allen and Kay Kartchner have been living in North Logan since 1967. They raised their seven children here and have many fond memories of North Logan over the years.



"It was a friendly, happy, really comfortable place," Kay said. She said the neighborhood where they live had plenty of kids for her children to grow up with. The Kartchners said many of their children live close by, so that makes it a really great place to live.

The Kartchners have seen North Logan grow from a farming community to a suburban area. "A lot of people have moved in, and that's great," Allen said.

STREETS

For November, we want to remind the residents that the [Winter Street Overnight Parking Ordinance](#) goes into effect November 1st, and runs through March 31st. People parking on North Logan streets need to be mindful of the date and time restrictions for overnight parking, as police will be writing tickets. This ordinance is in place to ensure the safety of our snow plow drivers and residents, as well as the property of residents, particularly during snow storms. We appreciate your cooperation as you adhere to the ordinance as follows:

[11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking Prohibited](#)

No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of midnight (12:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day, beginning November 1st and ending March 31st, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.

Also in November, our Streets Department will be continuing to work hard to get several city streets crack-sealed. The oil used to do this sets up after just a few minutes. However, in that short time before, it is important for traffic [not to drive through this material](#). If that happens, the oil will stick to tires, etc. as well as be pulled off of the road. Our crews will be closing travel lanes and setting up traffic cones around the areas that they are working. Thank you for your continuing support as we improve the city streets.

STORMWATER

With us being heavily into the fall season, here are a few reminders about fallen leaves:

1. Please keep leaves from your property on your property as much as possible.
2. City workers will run our street sweeper as much as possible to keep up with leaves. However, it is a large city with only one truck. We cannot be everywhere at once. Keeping the gutter clean in front of your house, and especially storm drains clear, greatly helps city crews.
3. We have received a lot of rain this year, and more could be coming. Keeping the gutters and drains clear helps ensure the stormwater drains properly. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

November also means a chance for snow. Remember to keep piled snow out of the gutter and off of the street. Also, avoid using too much ice melt, which is a source of water pollutants when used in excess. Thanks for your help in keeping our city and water clean.

WATER

Protecting your home's backflow assembly helps North Logan keep our drinking water protected. A broken backflow assembly could allow backflows to happen, which could contaminate our water system. Now that cold weather has arrived, be sure to have your culinary irrigation lines blown out. This will help keep your backflow assembly from freezing and breaking. We also recommend insulating your backflow

North Logan City needs your help in identifying your home's material type. The pipe material can be found at the water service line entering your home in your water heater room. LANDSCAPE CONVERSION PROGRAM REIMBURSEMENT

Tired of mowing your lawn? Ready to simplify your yard into a lower-maintenance and more water-efficient landscape? GOOD NEWS! The Utah Division of Water Resources has recently approved North Logan City residents to participate in their landscape conversion incentive programs! This means that you could receive a reimbursement for a portion of expenses incurred to convert your yard (or a portion of your yard) into a water-wise landscape. Simply head to <http://utahwatersavers.com>, enter "North Logan City" as your water provider, set up an account, submit plans for your landscape conversion, and become approved to receive a refund for your landscaping!



QPR - SUICIDE PREVENTION CLASS

The Bear River Health Department will be providing a QPR (Question, Persuade and Refer) Suicide Prevention Class on Thursday, November 30th, from 7-8 p.m. at the North Logan Library Conference Room. This class teaches anyone how to recognize the warning signs of suicide, and how to offer hope and get help to save a life.



WATER METER LIDS

Please make sure that the North Logan City water meter lids on your property remain clear of obstructions such as overgrown grass, vegetation, bark or other landscaping, vehicles, lawn decorations, etc. These meter lids have sensitive antennas that can be broken or blocked by such items, and can interfere with the signal that gives the City the read from the meter. We also need access for emergencies, as well as maintenance. Any damages done to the meters or antennas will be replaced at the homeowners' expense.
