GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings for January 2024 will take place on Wednesdays, January 3rd & 17th at 6:30 p.m. In January, the City Council will be considering a final resolution for the CIB Bond for the Community Center. There will also be updates regarding the City's water model and water master plan, and a public hearing for the semi-annual budget revision.

The Planning Commission meetings for January 2024 will take place on Thursdays, January 4th & 18th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings, or work session discussions on the following topics: ♦ Amendments to the Subdivision Ordinance required to comply with SB 174; and, ♦ NLC General Plan re-write project.

To stay informed on planning topics in the City, all City Council and Planning Commission agendas are published at least 24 hours in advance of any scheduled meetings, on the Utah Public Notice website (utah.gov). Feel free to create an account on the utah.gov site and follow the North Logan City Council or Planning Comm. to receive notifications of upcoming meetings. We also post our agendas on our website and on the North Logan City Facebook and Instagram pages prior to the meetings. 11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking Prohibited
No person shall park a vehicle on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of midnight (12:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day, beginning November 1st and ending March 31st of the following year, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.

STREETS

We ask you to please keep in mind, that when snow is forecast, it is helpful when our citizens remove vehicles, trailers, garbage cans, etc. from the roadway. By doing this, our plow drivers are able to clear the *entire* road, which helps prevent bottlenecks, as well as damage to vehicles and property. We appreciate everyone's cooperation during our winter months! Thank you for your support!!

Also, when clearing the snow from your driveways, please remember **it is against the law** to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, and children trying to pass on their way to school. Thank you for your cooperation!



STORMWATER

Winter is in full swing. Please remember the following:

1. Keep snow on your property when cleaning your driveway. Piled snow in the gutter or on the street is a stormwater violation.
2. Do not over-salt. Over-salting can lead to salt being washed down the storm drain, which is considered a pollutant.
3. City crews plow curb-to-curb to keep storm drains open. Please help to keep those open as much as possible.
4. Avoid storing materials or equipment on the road so plow crews can fully open the road.

CITIZEN INPUT NEEDED! LEAD REDUCTION PROGRAM

The Environmental Protection Agency is *requiring* a **full** inventory of the water service line types for **all properties** in Utah, North Logan City included.

There are four primary service line/pipe materials types, which are shown below. North Logan City is largely certain that we do not have any lead service lines. We are required, however, to verify this information, and we need your help in identifying your home's water service line type. *We need everyone's input!* To aid in helping you identify your home's service line material type, please follow the following steps:

How to Identify Your Service Line Type:

Step 1: Locate where your service line enters your home. This is normally located in a utility or hot water heater room.

Step 2: Locate the test area. Find the water shut off valve and/or pressure reducer valve (PRV). The test area is located between the shutoff valve and the floor or exterior wall.

Step 3: The material type can be identified through a visual inspection, a scratch test, or magnet test. In some cases, the pipe can clearly be identified as plastic or copper. In other cases, due to corrosion, the pipe needs to be scratched to reveal a copper penny color, or silver color. If it is a silver color the only way to determine between galvanized or lead is a magnet test. Magnets will stick to galvanized but will *not* stick to lead.

Step 4: Take a picture of your test area, then submit your findings through the survey link.

You can use this QR code to be taken directly to the survey to follow the directions and submit your findings.

MAYOR'S FAQ

1. How can I find out what issues are being discussed at city council?

The North Logan City Council typically meets on the first and third Wednesdays of the month. Agendas are posted on the city's website, the city's social media, and the state's public notice website (www.utah.gov/pmn). There is a general overview of City Council items in each month's newsletter. You can sign up for public meeting notices at www.utah.gov/pmn. Request to receive the City Council and Planning Commission agendas, by emailing Marie at marie@northlogancity.org. Additionally, before each meeting, I go through the agenda and explain each item on Instagram (@lyndsaylpeterson). We are also one of the few cities in the state that livestreams our meetings on YouTube (at the following link):

2. How will I know if a development is being proposed near my home?

The best way is to sign up for the resources identified in item #1. Additionally, the city will send out Parlant messages (text/email/phone calls) to residents in close proximity to proposed developments.

3. How do I report an issue?

Go to the city's website and fill out the form at <https://northlogancity.org/problem-or-concern/>. That will create a work order for the correct department to address.

4. How can I be more informed about what's going on in North Logan City?

SEWER RATES

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter water usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your winter average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.
