### GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

**The City Council meetings for February 2024 will take place on Wednesdays, February 7<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:30 p.m.** In February, the City Council will have discussions regarding the city's water Master Plan and the potential sale of the existing city offices. The City Council will also consider approval of a one-lot subdivision at the corner of 200W 2850N, along with a city-wide franchise agreement related to fiber. Departmental FY2025 budget presentations will start at the second meeting in February.

The Planning Commission meetings in February will take place on Thursdays, February 8<sup>th</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings, or work session discussions on the following topics: A NLC General Plan re-write project; A Conditional Use Kennel Permit at 2225 E 3025 N; A Conditional Use Permit Amendment for the New Life Fellowship Church expansion project; and, A Preliminary Plat and Development Plan for a one-lot commercial subdivision at 200 W 2850 N.

# NORTH PARK POLICE

As the winter season approached, I took the opportunity in previous newsletters to ask for your support in moving parked vehicles off the roadway, so that city snowplow drivers could more efficiently remove the snow from our roads. I want to thank our residents for their efforts in this regard. Officers from North Park Police Department have seen a noticeable decline in the number of vehicles left unattended. This has made it much easier, and safer, for our snowplow drivers to clear the snow from the roadways.

In this edition, I wanted to discuss a concern that many residents have called in about, and our public works employees have asked us to address. The concern involves residents who are pushing snow from their property out across a street, and in some cases leaving a large snow pile in the roadway.

NLC Municipal code 11-310 reads:

<u>11-310 Placing Trash Or Other Obstruction In Streets, Gutters, Sidewalks</u> It shall be unlawful for any person owning, occupying, or having control of any premise to place, or permit to be placed upon or in the sidewalk, parking area, gutter, or on the half of the street next to such premise:

- Any broken ware, glass, filth, rubbish, sweepings, refuse matter, <u>ice, snow</u>, water, garbage, ashes, tin cans or other like substances.
- 2. Any wagons, lumber, wood boxes, fencing, building material, dead trees, tree stumps, merchandise, or other thing which shall obstruct such public street, gutter, parking area or sidewalk, or any part thereof, or the passage over and upon the same, or any part thereof, except as expressly authorized by ordinances, without the permission of the governing body first be obtained.
- 3. Any permanent or temporary structure, mechanism, device, vehicle, or other thing of any kind or character except trees planted pursuant to the provisions of applicable ordinances.

The danger of having snow pushed out into the road is that it can suddenly disrupt the traction of a vehicle's tires. During winter driving conditions, this can be especially dangerous. In addition, pushing snow into the roadway can create icy spots and snow ridges that can damage vehicles when not noticed. As the snow continues to fall, we ask that you follow these guidelines in your snow removal efforts.



# STREETS

We ask you to please keep in mind, that when snow is forecast, it is helpful when our citizens remove vehicles, trailers, garbage cans, etc. from the roadway. By doing this, our plow drivers are able to clear the *entire* road, which helps prevent bottlenecking, as well as damage to vehicles and property. We appreciate everyone's cooperation during our winter months! Thank you for your support!!

Also, when clearing the snow from your driveways, please remember **it is against the law** to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please

also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, exercisers, and children trying to pass on their way to school.

## **STORMWATER**

Here are a few reminders for the winter months:

- 1. Keep snow on your property. While moving snow, avoid piling it in the gutter or streets.
- 2. Avoid using too much ice melt. Too much can run down the storm drains and is considered a pollutant.
- 3. It is a violation to pump any water into the gutters. Water must be kept on your property when possible.

### SEWER RATES

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter water usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your winter average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.

# CITIZEN INPUT NEEDED! LEAD REDUCTION PROGRAM

The Environmental Protection Agency is <u>requiring</u> a <u>full</u> inventory of the water service line types for <u>all properties</u> in Utah, North Logan City included.

There are four primary service line/pipe materials types, which are shown below. North Logan City is largely certain that we do not have any lead service lines. We are required, however, to verify this information, and we need your help in identifying your home's water service line type. *We need everyone's input!* If we are unable to confirm your water line's material type, we may need to dig small holes in your yard to physically verify. *PLEASE submit a survey response to avoid all digging!* To aid in helping you identify your home's service line material type, please follow the following steps:

#### How to Identify Your Service Line Type:

**Step 1:** Locate where your service line enters your home. This is normally located in a utility or hot water heater room.

**Step 2:** Locate the test area. Find the water shut-off valve and/or pressure reducer valve (PRV). The test area is located between the shut-off valve and the floor or exterior wall.

**Step 3:** The material type can be identified through a visual inspection, a scratch test, or magnet test. In some cases, the pipe can clearly be identified as plastic or copper. In other cases, due to corrosion,



the pipe needs to be scratched to reveal a copper penny color, or silver color. If it is a silver color, the only way to determine between galvanized or lead is a magnet test. Magnets will stick to galvanized but will <u>not</u> stick to lead.

**Step 4:** Take a picture of your test area, then submit your findings through the survey link.

# 1. What are my duties during and after a snowstorm?

North Logan City Code 11-309 specifies that you must remove snow from sidewalks within a "reasonable" amount of time after the snowstorm. If the snowstorm occurs during the nighttime hours (5 p.m. to 6 a.m.), then you must remove the snow before 9 a.m. I know firsthand that shoveling massive amounts of snow can be exhausting, but your neighbors will appreciate your efforts.

2. What are the ordinances about parking on the street in the winter months? North Logan City Code 11-604 prohibits parking on the street between the hours of 12 a.m. - 6 a.m. from November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>. The NPPD has been cracking down on this illegal parking lately, so be sure you move your car off-street overnight.

# 3. How can I make the snow plow drivers' jobs easier?

What a great question! Our snowplow drivers are top notch and set the standard across the state. Blowing or shoveling snow into the road isn't just annoying to your neighbors--it can be very dangerous for snow plow drivers who unexpectedly hit the pile of snow you just bladed into the street. It can cause the plows to abruptly stop or to list sideways in response to the barrier of snow, which creates a risk of the huge trucks hitting parked vehicles, or in worst case: pedestrians.

Also, pushing snow to the sides of the roads and thereby narrowing the street can cause similar problems. Please push/blow your snow onto your own property! Let's keep our snowplow drivers safe while they're working day and night to keep our roads clear.
