In fact, many other cities throughout the state reach out to North Logan asking for our plan, so they can incorporate the same in their municipalities. This plan is only successful because of our great residents who truly understand the need to conserve, and have made changes to their watering needs by remove large areas of grass; installing water-wise landscaping, and not overwatering grass.

As we move into spring and summer, this is a friendly reminder to keep up doing what you are doing. While we may not be in a drought today, history has taught us that it is always just around the corner. Conserving today makes a significant impact for when those tough times come.

### GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings for March 2024 will take place on Wednesdays, March 6<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. In March, the City Council will consider approving commercial subdivisions located at 1950N 100E, and 2850N 200W. The City Council will also consider approving an update to the City's Culinary Water Master Plan, along with a change to tiered culinary water rates for subdivisions with secondary water. There will also be FY2025 budget proposals for the Parks, Cemetery, Recreation, Stormwater, Streets Sewer, and Water Departments.

The Planning Commission meetings in March will take place on Thursdays, March 7<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings or work session discussions on the following topics:  $\bullet$  the NLC General Plan re-write project;  $\bullet$  a Preliminary Plat and Development Plan for a 3-lot commercial subdivision at approximately 100 East and 1950 N;  $\bullet$  a City-initiated text amendment to the City's signage ordinance; and,  $\bullet$  a City-initiated text amendments to define of a "Lot of Record" and apply applicable development standards.

# NORTH PARK POLICE

Recently, North Logan and Hyde Park cities have experienced a rash of burglaries that have impacted multiple families and residents. In this article, I wanted to provide an update on our investigation, as well as these tips to help prevent break-ins.

### Burglary Update:

North Park detectives have arrested three suspects and are working hard to review the evidence to link the burglaries and suspects together. We appreciate the support from the community members who have come in to the Police Department to help identify property that our detectives have recovered. As your Police Chief, I have asked my officers to make a concerted effort to be visible in North Logan, and our detectives are actively working to solve these crimes. Please do not hesitate to reach out to our officers if you need help or see anything suspicious.

#### **Burglary Prevention Tips:**

One of the most important things you can do to protect your property and home is to call the police to report ANY suspicious activity when you notice it. Please remember to lock the windows and doors on your home and outbuildings; leave your lights on when you are away; and, make your home look occupied. Keep your garage door locked. Lock your car doors as you go inside, and consider moving garage door openers out of sight. Burglars are looking for the easy target! Have your mail and packages picked up and consider having your lawn mowed while you are away for an extended period of time. As we all watch out for one another, we can help reduce crime throughout the neighborhoods.

# STREETS

We ask you to please keep in mind, that when snow is forecast, it is helpful when our citizens remove vehicles, trailers, garbage cans, etc. from the roadway. By doing this, our plow drivers are able to clear the entire road, which helps prevent bottlenecking, as well as damage to vehicles and property. We appreciate everyone's cooperation during our winter months! Remember that the Winter Parking Ordinance (11-604) is still in place until March 31<sup>st</sup>, and there is parking allowed on any roadway between the hours of midnight (12:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day. Thank you for your support!

Also, when clearing the snow from your driveways, please remember it is against the law to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers! Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, exercisers, and children trying to pass on their way to school.

When the weather is calmer, our street crew has been hauling snow from cul-de-sacs and clearing storm drains, to prevent flooding. If you notice any water pooling in the gutters, please contact the city office at (435)752-1310 so we can look into the situation.

## STORMWATER

With warmer weather most likely on the way, please remember the following:

- 1. Winter leaves the gutters dirty. We will be sending the sweeper out for our spring cleaning. Please be patient with us; we will hit every road and neighborhood.
- 2. As the snow melts, sometimes grates get plugged up. We will monitor this, but if you notice one feel free to call the city office at (435)752-1310, and we will come clean it up. You may also help clear it.
- As you begin landscaping or other projects, remember it is a violation to store any materials in the road or in the curb and gutter.

### **SEWER RATES**

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter water usage (November - April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your winter average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.

# **MAYOR'S FAQ**

You may have heard that North Logan City is revamping our General Plan over the next year. This is a big process required by the state of Utah, and it's an opportunity for you to shape our community for the future. Here are some frequently asked questions about the plan:

#### 1. What is a general plan?

A general plan is a long-term plan made by cities to organize development and community initiatives. It details the vision, policies and framework developed by the community, that guide growth and development in a neighborhood over a period of time, usually 20-30 years.

#### 2. How can I give my input?

- . Go to nlcplan.org and see any news/ updates on the plan.
- Subscribe via email by emailing receptionist@northlogancity.org and asking to be added to the list to get updates on the plan.
- Review the draft plan, submit comments, or to see progress on corresponding ordinance updates at nlcplan.org.
- Keep a lookout for open house meetings where you can submit your input in person.
