If you've driven past the new city offices, you'll see that we're approaching the end of construction! The NORTH LOGAN CITY sign is up -- announcing our legitimacy to everyone who drives past. We will have city offices we can be proud of with several conference rooms, our own City Council chambers, and even a mayor's office. The building will be nestled in the shadow of two existing city favorites: the North Logan Library and the North Park Police Department.

We're so fortunate to have received a generous donation from the Hansen Family that has enabled the city to fund this project with no bond or debt burden on the taxpayers. We've worked with our builder, Lundahl Construction, to identify every way we can to achieve cost savings. Our Parks department will fill the exterior with water-wise plants, and we'll now be able to house our exemplary community emergency response team (CERT) in-house. We're ecstatic about all of the ways this building will help us better serve our community.

We're planning to move furniture to the new building in April, put on the finishing touches in May, and will be hosting an open house for the public on June 3<sup>rd</sup>. We hope you will come celebrate what this beautiful new building means for our community!

**GOVERNMENT MEETINGS** (Agendas: [pmn.utah.gov](http://pmn.utah.gov))

**The City Council will only have one meeting for April 2024, which will take place on Wednesday, April 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library.** The City Council will hold a public hearing to discuss the future of the North Logan/Hyde Park Justice Court. There will be several FY2025 draft departmental budget discussions, including for the Library, Police, Facilities, General Government, General Taxes and Fees, RDA, and LBA.

**The Planning Commission will only have one meeting in April 2024, which will take place on Thursday, April 11<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library.** The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings or work session discussions on the following topics:

- ◆ Joint work session with City Council to discuss the NLC General Plan;
- ◆ Commercial subdivision Concept Plan for a single-lot subdivision at approximately 3100 N and Main St.;
- ◆ Conditional Use Permit amendment for an addition to the Thomas Edison Charter School;
- ◆ Text amendment to the City's signage ordinance; and,
- ◆ Text amendments to define of a "Lot of Record" and apply applicable development standards.

**NORTH PARK POLICE**

North Logan has some of the most premiere outdoor opportunities in all of Cache Valley. With the warmer weather, more of us are enjoying time outside with our animals. We would like to remind you that North Logan City code requires that all pets be kept under physical restraint (i.e., leash) by their owner when off of your own property, within city limits. This includes within our city parks. This is for the safety of all who enjoy the parks or recreation areas.

Recently, North Park Police Department has noticed an increase in complaints about pet owners not cleaning up after their animals when they defecate on city property, athletic fields, or in recreation areas. Animal Control has tried to be more visible in the parks watching for owners who allow their pets off-leash and do not clean up after their animals. When owners are responsible for their pets, the city parks remain cleaner and more inviting to all.

Lastly, the Police Department has responded to several 'trespass in progress' calls where individuals are looking for shed antlers and are walking onto people's property without permission. Be aware, that between February 1 through April 15, you are required to have a permit issued through the DWR to gather deer sheds. It is also unlawful for anyone to venture onto private property to collect deer antlers without the permission of the property owner. If it is observed and reported, violators could potentially be cited by the Police Department for trespassing. If there are any concerns or questions, please feel free to reach out to the Police Department by calling 435-753-7600.

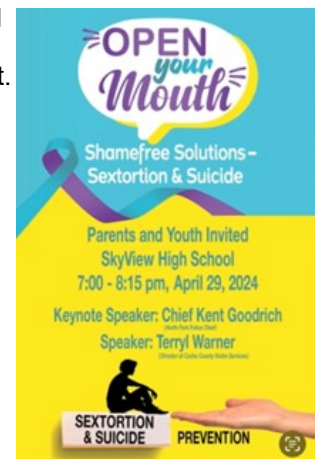

## STREETS

We ask you to please keep in mind, that when snow is forecast, it is helpful when our citizens remove vehicles, trailers, garbage cans, etc. from the roadway. By doing this, our plow drivers are able to clear the *entire* road, which helps prevent bottlenecks, as well as damage to vehicles and property. We appreciate everyone's cooperation during our winter months! The overnight Winter Parking Ordinance ends March 31<sup>st</sup>; however, we ask that residents still help us out when snow is forecast. If we can keep vehicles, trailers, etc. off of the streets when snow comes through, then the plow crews can clean things up much more efficiently and safely.

## WATER METER LIDS

Please make sure that the North Logan City water meter lids on your property remain clear of obstructions such as overgrown grass, vegetation, bark or other landscaping, vehicles, lawn decorations, etc. These meter lids have sensitive antennas that can be broken or blocked by such items, and can interfere with the signal that gives the city the read from the meter. We also need access for emergencies, as well as maintenance. Any damages done to the meters or antennas will be replaced at the homeowners' expense. Thank you for your cooperation.



## STORMWATER

Spring is here, and depending on the weather, the State DWQ would like us to be aware of a few reminders for lawn care and maintenance:

1. September is the best month to use fertilizer. When using fertilizer, use slow-release or time-release with soluble nitrogen.
2. Only fertilize once you have cut your grass a minimum of three times.
3. A common myth is that more is synonymous with better when discussing lawn health. That isn't always the case! Someone should only use two pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet. Two pounds per 1,000 square feet will give you the best results and save you money.
4. Leave grass clippings on the lawn to reduce the need for fertilizer and promote a more full and healthy lawn.
5. Spot treat weeds when you can't handpick them, and don't douse the entire area.
6. If the forecast has rain or any other wet weather event, try not to spread or apply fertilizer and pesticides.
7. Sweep driveways and sidewalks rather than wash them with a hose.

A General Plan is a legally-required document that guides current and long-term growth, directs capital investments, and, provides the rationale for local ordinances. The state requires general plans to address issues such as land uses, housing, and transportation. North Logan's current plan was developed and adopted over ten years ago (2013) and is in need of a comprehensive update to meet the city's current demands and future vision. The public is invited to participate in the creation of this updated General Plan! ## PARKS - ATHLETIC FIELD USE

Just as a reminder to our citizens who enjoy our parks and fields, there are times it is necessary for the City to close the Athletic Fields in our parks during certain times of the year; to ensure safe playing conditions for the athletes, as well as to maintain the fields in the best, and most cost-effective ways possible. Per the City's Athletic Field Policy, *City fields will be available for use, weather permitting, according to the published availability schedule. (All grass athletic fields are closed from Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> through Mid-April or as specified by the Parks Director.) Teams may not use fields for games or scheduled scrimmage unless approved and pre-scheduled.* Thank you so much for your understanding and cooperation! ## SEWER RATES

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six-month average winter water usage (November - April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your winter average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.

## WATER

As spring arrives, it's tempting to jump into our regular lawn care routines. However, before you turn on your culinary irrigation system, consider this: April marks a period when many lawns are still dormant from the winter months. Dormant grass doesn't need as much water to survive. In fact, watering during this time can be not only unnecessary, but also wasteful. By allowing your grass to remain dormant, you're helping it conserve energy and moisture, promoting its natural resilience.

Here are a few reasons why you should consider holding off on watering your lawn in April:

1. Conservation: Water is a precious resource, and by refraining from watering dormant grass, you're contributing to water conservation efforts.
2. Cost Savings: Did you know that watering your lawn can significantly impact your culinary water bill? By skipping unnecessary culinary watering sessions, you'll see a noticeable reduction in your monthly water bill.
3. Sewer Bills: North Logan City calculates sewer bills based on culinary winter water usage (Nov.-April). By using less water for your lawn, you'll also pay less in sewer charges.

## MAYOR'S FAQ

In early 2022, Logan City announced that they would no longer be offering garbage, green waste, or recycling pick-up services. Since that time, North Logan City has joined the Cache Waste Consortium (CWC) in contracting with Waste Management to provide garbage hauling services for our area.

### 1. When does green waste curbside collection start?

Green waste curbside collection will run from April 1<sup>st</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>.

### 2. What is the monthly charge for green waste?

\$10.50 per month for all 12 months of the year.

### 3. Will we ever get the green waste dumpsters back in Elk Ridge park?

The dumpsters will be available only for designated green waste clean up days and only once or twice a year. We will advertise those days so you'll know about them well in advance.

### 4. What should I do if I no longer wish to utilize curbside green waste?

As a city, we are adjusting to these changes as they fully develop. We are confident that Waste Management is working hard on our behalf to negotiate fair and reasonable rates for our garbage collection needs.
