GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings in May will take place on Wednesdays, May 1st & 15th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library. The City Council will consider approval of a tentative FY2025 municipal budget at the first meeting in May. They will also consider a development plan for a new commercial subdivision on Main St. The first meeting in May will have proclamations for the Pumpkin Walk donors and the Fire Department. The second meeting in May will have a proclamation for the Police Dept.

The one Planning Commission meeting in May will take place on Thursday, May 16th at 6:30 p.m. at the North Logan Library (the May 2nd meeting is cancelled). The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings or work session discussions on the following topics:

◆Joint work session with City Council to discuss the NLC General Plan; ◆City-initiated text amendment to the City's signage ordinance; and, ◆City-initiated text amendments to define a "Lot of Record" and apply applicable development standards.

STREETS

With winter coming to an end, our streets crew will be getting into the routine of summer maintenance. Our crew will be crack-sealing roads, with a main focus on the areas between 1600 E and 800 E, along with other roads around town that are in worse condition. This is a relatively quick process, however, the oil used to fill the cracks in the road does need time to dry before traffic drives on it. We will only be shifting traffic lanes for the most part, and will only close travel lanes where necessary.

We will also continue work on sidewalks that have been lifted by tree roots, etc. Any sections lifted between a half-inch and two inches can be ground down to eliminate tripping hazards. Anything beyond a two-inch lift will need to be removed and replaced. There are numerous sidewalk sections around town that need replacement, and we plan to make a big effort this season to repair/replace our failing sidewalks around the city. Feel free to submit to the city any problem areas that you are aware of. These problems are usually placed on a list to prioritize the areas in the most need of repair.

Once asphalt batch plants begin operating for the season, we will also be aggressively replacing failing portions of asphalt around the city. Once our crews begin this work it may be necessary to temporarily close traffic lanes in order to make the required repairs.

Please be aware of, as well as courteous to our crew, as they undergo these tasks. Thank you!!

WATER METER LIDS

Please make sure that the North Logan City water meter lids on your property remain clear of obstructions such as overgrown grass, vegetation, bark or other landscaping, vehicles, lawn decorations, etc. These meter lids have sensitive antennas that can be broken or blocked by such items, and can interfere with the signal that gives the city the read from the meter. We also need access for emergencies, as well as maintenance. Any damages done to the meters or antennas will be replaced at the homeowners' expense. Thank you for your cooperation.



STORMWATER

We want to remind everyone that it is against city ordinance and a stormwater violation to dump grass clippings, weeds, green waste, or any other waste into our canals. Any debris will get washed down to grates placed throughout the canal. When it reaches these grates, it gets caught and builds dams. Water can no longer flow properly, and flooding occurs. Please refrain from dumping ANYTHING into the canals and help protect your neighbors and their property downstream. Thanks for your cooperation.

NORTH LOGAN'S VISION FOR TOMORROW: YOUR INPUT NEEDED!

North Logan City is in the process of creating a new General Plan! A General Plan is a legally-required document that guides current and long-term growth, directs capital investments, and, provides the rationale for local ordinances. The state requires general plans to address issues such as land uses, housing, and transportation. North Logan's current plan was developed and adopted over ten years ago (2013) and is in need of a comprehensive update to meet the city's current demands and future vision. The public is invited to participate in the creation of this updated General Plan! The best way to engage in the process is by visiting the dedicated project websites (which are listed below) to take surveys and provide digital comments. Additionally, the public can participate in upcoming public meetings. These meetings will be advertised through various channels including the project website. PARKS

Pets: We would like to remind all pet owners, that North Logan City code requires that all pets be kept under physical restraint (i.e., leash) by their owner when off of your own property, within city limits. This includes within our city parks. This is for the safety of all who enjoy the parks or recreation areas. However, there are a few places within the parks where even leashed pets are **NOT** allowed, namely: designated sports fields, courts, and artificial turf fields. Players, parents, and coaches do NOT want to play on athletic fields where there is pet waste or urine, or even the after-effects when it has been cleaned up. Park visitors are expected to clean up after their pets! Please remember to bring a bag for your pet waste, as you are expected to clean it up immediately. Animal Control has tried to be more visible in the parks watching for owners who allow their pets off-leash and do not clean up after their animals. When owners are responsible for their pets, the city parks remain cleaner and more inviting to all. Please call us at the City Office at 435-752-1310 if you have any questions or concerns.

Splash Pads: The Splash Pad at Elk Ridge Park is scheduled to be open Fri., May 31st, and the one at Meadow View Park should be open by Fri., June 14th, if not sooner.

SEWER

Residents, please remember that the only item that is allowed to be put into the Sanitary Sewer System, aside from natural waste, is toilet paper! Please **DO NOT** flush items such as wipes (even "flushable" ones, as they *do not* break down in sewer system), feminine hygiene products, cleaning wipes, paper towels, trash, towels, cloth of any kind, diapers, toys, grease, Q-tips, or medications, etc. Please dispose of these products properly in solid waste/trash bins. Having the Sanitary Sewer System function properly, and maintaining the health of our community, are important to both North Logan City Administration and Staff.

WATER

Water Restrictions

Water Restrictions will remain in effect this summer. Water restrictions help tremendously in enabling us to meet the growing demand for water during the summer months. Water restrictions also help to promote water conservation by encouraging residences and businesses to be more mindful of their culinary water usage.

Please strive to postpone lawn watering with culinary (city) water until June 1st, if possible. If you must water, please abide by the address watering schedule below:

May's Water Restrictions:

Homes utilizing culinary (city) water for lawn watering are required to abide by the 3-days-per-week watering schedule as follows:

ODD ADDRESSES:

Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays

EVEN ADDRESSES:

Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays

No watering allowed on Sundays.

Properties that have access to culinary (city) water *and* secondary (canal) water for lawn watering, are required to use secondary (canal) water ONLY. Secondary water users will receive their schedule via their canal companies.

Landscape Incentive (Flip the Strip Program)

Are you ready to transition your lawn/yard and/or park strip into a water efficient landscape? **GOOD NEWS!** The Utah Division of Water Resources has recently approved North Logan City residents to participate in their landscape conversion incentive programs. Commonly referred to as "Flip the Strip," you can now receive a reimbursement for a portion of expenses incurred converting your park strip or yard into a water-wise landscape!
