GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The <u>one</u> City Council meeting in July will take place on Wednesday, July 17th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the new North Logan City offices, at 2525 N 600 E. The City Council will hold a public hearing on July 17th to receive input on proposed Council of Government (COG) road applications for both 200 East, and a roundabout on 1200 East 3100 North. The City may also consider approving a municipal boundary plat to modify the north boundary of the City.

The Planning Commission will only meet <u>once</u> in July on Thursday, July 18th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the new North Logan City offices, at 2525 N 600 E. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings or work session discussions on the following topics: ◆General Plan Re-Write Project; ◆text amendment to the city's subdivision ordinance regarding secondary water requirements for new development; and, ◆text amendments to refine development requirements within geologic hazard areas.

NORTH LOGAN HAS NEW ISO RATING

After seven years of being rated an ISO Class 5, North Logan's Fire Department Public Protection Classification (ISO Rating) has achieved a Class 2! ISO (Insurance Services Office) analyzes the effectiveness of a fire department's fire suppression capabilities, dispatch system, and water availability/supply. Most insurance companies use this rating in analyzing and assessing your insurance premiums. Departments are rated from 1 to 10, Class 1 being the highest. There is typically a 3-5% change in insurance costs between each class.

What does this mean for North Logan residents & businesses? This improved score may reduce your homeowner or business insurance.

Does the ISO rating automatically change premiums for North Logan residents and business owners?

No. You must notify your insurance carrier that your ISO rating has improved to a Class 2. The change is <u>effective July 1, 2024, after</u> which all insurance carriers will have access to the rating.

Congratulations to the Logan City Fire Department, the Cache/Logan Dispatch Center and the North Logan City Water Department for their combined effort to obtain this impressive score!

FIREWORKS REGULATIONS

Outlined below are the regulations for 2024 for the discharge of fireworks, for the following dates, times, and areas:

Fireworks are never allowed in restricted areas.

East Bench Area Restricted

* The discharge of fireworks is <u>restricted</u> in the area east of 1600 East, from the northern city boundary to the southern city boundary.

What is Allowed:

- * Class "C" fireworks may be discharged in <u>unrestricted areas</u> between the hours of 11:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m., July 2nd to July 5th (hours are extended to midnight on July 4th); and July 22nd to July 25th (hours are extended to midnight on July 24th).
- Class "C" fireworks are legally sold from June 24th to July 25th.

STREETS

For the first two weeks of July, we will be operating our street sweeper on 1200 East, 2700 North, sections of 400 East, and 2500 North, in order to clean up excess rock chips that will be a byproduct of our chip seal project taking place on the last week of June. We plan to clean up this debris as quickly as possible; however, you are urged to travel slowly on these roads in order to prevent chipped windshields, vehicles sliding, etc. Please give our street sweeper plenty of room to ensure that you and our workers can remain safe. We appreciate your cooperation with our efforts to provide the best streets possible for our citizens in North Logan.

Our Streets Department will also be continuing working on asphalt repairs on the city roads. We have several areas around the city that require attention, and we will be working throughout town as quickly as possible. If citizens notice any pot holes, sink holes, etc. please let us know by filing out a work order on our website at <u>northlogancity.org</u>, or by calling the city office at (435)752-1310.

We will also be touching up all paint marking such as crosswalks, stop bars, etc. in the city. This is a time-consuming process, where our crews will need to cone off sections of the road to paint. These cones will remain in place until the paint has dried enough to allow traffic to drive on it. Please be mindful and respectful to these areas while they dry; both in respect to our workers, and to prevent paint from getting on your vehicles.

STORMWATER

With the warm weather we wanted to remind everyone of a few things:

- 1. Canals are storm ways too. Please do not dump anything in the canals, in order to help keep water flowing through them.
- 2. Dispose of waste in proper containers and areas to help keep pollutants from entering our system. Dirt and grass clippings count as pollutants!
- 3. Contain all oils from any engine work in drip pans and contain car wash water as much as possible
- 4. If you received an email from the city about inspecting a pond, please do so and submit the filled-out report.

PARKS

Pets: North Logan City requires all pets to be leashed when off the owner's property, including in city parks. Pets are not allowed on sports fields, courts, or artificial turf fields. Pet owners <u>must</u> clean up after their pets immediately. Animal Control monitors parks for compliance to ensure a clean and safe environment for all.

Splash Pads: The Splash Pad at Elk Ridge Park is currently running (operating hours vary). The Meadow View Park Splash Pad is running intermittently as they work on improving it, therefore regular hours are yet to be determined. When the hours are set, we will post them on our city websites. We appreciate your patience and wish you all a safe and happy summer!

PARK RESERVATIONS

Reservations are now open for all of North Logan City Parks. To reserve a pavilion, go to the North Logan City's website at <u>northlogancity.org</u>. Under *"I want to,"* click on *"Reserve"* and then *"Park/Facility."* This will allow you to view a calendar and see when things are available to rent. Pavilions are \$25 for residents and \$35 for non-residents. Any and all organized groups <u>must</u> reserve areas before using them, or be subject to being asked to leave. For all field reservations, please call Mary at the city office at 435-755-1310 ext. 120. Field rentals are \$10/hour per field.

JULY WATER RESTRICTIONS

Water Restrictions will remain in effect this summer. Water restrictions help tremendously in enabling us to meet the growing demand for water during the summer months. Water restrictions also help to promote water conservation by encouraging residents and business owners to be more mindful of their culinary water usage.

When you must water, please abide by the address watering schedule below:

July's Water Restrictions:

Homes utilizing culinary (city) water for lawn watering are required to abide by the 3-daysper-week watering schedule as follows:

ODD ADDRESSES:

Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays

EVEN ADDRESSES:

Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays **No watering allowed on Sundays.**

Properties that have access to culinary (city) water *and* secondary (canal) water for lawn watering, are <u>required</u> to use <u>secondary</u> (canal) water **ONLY**. Secondary water users will receive their schedule via their canal companies.

Landscape Incentive (Flip the Strip Program):

Are you ready to transition your lawn/yard and/ or park strip into a water efficient landscape? GOOD NEWS! The Utah Division of Water Resources has recently approved North Logan City residents to participate in their landscape conversion incentive programs. Commonly referred to as "Flip the Strip," you can now receive a reimbursement for a portion of expenses incurred converting your park strip or yard into a water-wise landscape!

SEWER
