GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The <u>one</u> City Council meeting in September will take place on Wednesday, September 18th at 6:30 p.m., in the City Council Chambers at the North Logan City offices (2525 N 600 E). In September, the City Council will hold a public hearing to consider the issuance of bonds for the water system. There will be an additional public hearing to consider an adjustment to the municipal boundary at 3100N 1200E. There will also be updates regarding the City Center study.

The Planning Commission will only meet once in September on Thursday, September 19th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the North Logan City offices (2525 N 600 E). The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings, or work session discussions on the following topics: ◆text amendment to the City's subdivision and zoning ordinances regarding secondary water requirements for new development; and, ◆text amendments to refine development requirements within geologic hazard areas.

General Plan Public Workshop

The Planning Commission will be hosting a Public Workshop for the General Plan rewrite project on Tuesday, September 3rd. This event will be held at the new large pavilion at Meadow View Park, just south of the pickleball courts, from 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. Topics to be reviewed by the public include a draft Future Land Use Map for the city as a whole, along with a more acute draft map for the City Center area.

GARBAGE PICK UP (Cans need to be out by 6 a.m.)

With the recent changes made as Waste Management (WM) determines the best routes, <u>pick-up days for all of North Logan</u> garbage are now on either <u>Thursdays or Fridays</u> depending on where you live, and in some cases, on which side of the street. Recycling is still picked up every other week, and green waste is picked up every week for the green waste pick-up season (Apr. 1-Oct. 31). NORTH PARK POLICE

Welcome back students! As school starts up again, North Park Police would like to bring to your attention the safety rules regarding school crosswalks. Many of our students bike or walk to school and use the crosswalks daily. Please remember:

41-6a-1002: Pedestrians' right-of-way.

1) The operator of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way by slowing down or stopping if necessary:

- a. To a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is on the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling; or,
- b. When the pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in danger.
- 2) The operator of a vehicle approaching a school crosswalk shall come to a **complete stop** at the school crosswalk if the crosswalk is occupied by a person.
- 3) If a vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk or at any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection to permit a pedestrian to cross the roadway, the operator of any other vehicle approaching from the rear **may not overtake and pass** the stopped vehicle.

Please follow the directions of our crossing guards. Our crossing guards play a critical role in helping our students remain safe as they walk or bike to school. The biggest threat to our students and crossing guards is from vehicles turning left or right. If you are in a hurry, consider taking an alternate route and avoiding the crosswalks at the start and end of school.

STREETS

As the weather begins to cool off in September, our crew will begin crack sealing the roads again. We do not plan to have many road closures with this project, and those we do have should last no longer than a couple of hours. Please avoid driving on freshly applied crack seal as it needs time to cure before traffic is reintroduced to those sections.

Asphalt repair will continue throughout this coming month. With this task, the crew is simply replacing failed spots in the road. This project is very non-invasive to traffic, however, be aware of traffic cones, signs, etc.

Our crew is also working to replace sidewalks that have been lifted by tree roots, etc. When replacing these sections of concrete, it is necessary to remove the tree roots that are causing the issue. If this is not done, then the roots will continue expanding and will lift the new sidewalk to the point of needing repairs within a few years. Our team will do everything possible to preserve the health of the trees, however, root removal is necessary for continued pedestrian safety.

We will also be touching up all paint markings, such as crosswalks, stop bars, etc., in the city. This is a time-consuming process where our crews will need to cone off sections of the road to paint. These cones will remain in place until the paint has dried enough to allow traffic to drive on it. Please be mindful and respectful to these areas while they dry, both in respect to our workers, and to prevent paint from getting on your vehicles. We appreciate your cooperation!

STORMWATER

Here are some helpful tips about lawn care. September is the ideal time to apply fertilizer. Follow the tips below and make sure to keep lawn clippings and fertilizer out of the gutters:

- 1. A common myth is that more is synonymous with better when discussing lawn health. That isn't always the case! Someone should only use two pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet. Implementing this practice will give you the best results and save you money.
- 2. Leave grass clippings on the lawn to reduce the need for fertilizer and promote a more full and healthy lawn.
- 3. Spot-treat weeds when you can't hand-pick them, and don't soak the entire area.
- 4. Know the weather ahead and don't apply fertilizers or pesticides when rain or other weather events are forecast in the immediate future.
- 5. Sweep driveways and sidewalks rather than wash with a hose.

SEPTEMBER WATER RESTRICTIONS

Water Restrictions will remain in effect this summer. Water restrictions help tremendously in enabling us to meet the growing demand for water during the summer months. Water restrictions also help to promote water conservation by encouraging residents and business owners to be more mindful of their culinary water usage.

When watering, please abide by the address watering schedule below. Properties utilizing culinary (city) water are permitted to water up to three (3) days per week following this schedule:

> ODD ADDRESSES: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays

EVEN ADDRESSES: Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays No watering allowed on Sundays.

Properties that have access to culinary (city) water and secondary (canal) water for lawn watering, are required to use secondary (canal) water ONLY. Secondary water users will receive their schedule via their canal companies.

Landscape Incentive (Flip the Strip Program): Are you ready to transition your lawn/yard and/or park strip into a water efficient landscape? GOOD NEWS! The Utah Division of Water Resources has recently approved North City residents to participate in their landscape conversion incentive programs. Commonly referred to as "Flip the Strip," you can now receive a reimbursement for a portion of expenses incurred converting your park strip or yard into a water-wise landscape! LEAD SERVICE LINE INVENTORY

City staff has completed the Lead Service Line Inventory verification process required by the state and the EPA. We have found zero lead service lines in North Logan! Our report was submitted to the state in August where they approved it, months ahead of the national deadline. In fact, North Logan was the first town in Cache Valley to successfully be approved, and one of the first few dozen in the state!

We would like to thank the hundreds of households who submitted information to us. Without you, this process would have taken significantly longer. But because of you, we as a community were successful!
