GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings in October will take place on Wednesdays, October 2nd and 16th, at 6:30 p.m., in the City Council Chambers at the North Logan City offices (2525 N 600 E). The first City Council meeting in October will have a public hearing regarding proposed Impact Fee (parks, roads, water, sewer) revisions. There will also be a status report from the new code enforcement officer, and a proposed update to the City's subdivision ordinance as it relates to secondary water. The second City Council meeting will be a joint workshop with the Planning Commission regarding the North Logan General Plan.

The Planning Commission will only meet once in October on Thursday, October 3rd at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers of the North Logan City offices (2525 N 600 E). The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings, or work session discussions on the following topics: ◆Text amendments to refine development requirements within geologic hazard areas; and, ◆Review of draft General Plan chapters and content. Please also note that there will be a joint workshop held with the City Council and Planning Commission to discuss the General Plan re-write project, on the City Council meeting night, Wednesday, October 16th.

GARBAGE PICK UP (Cans need to be out by 6 a.m.) Pick-up days for <u>all North Logan garbage services</u> are on either <u>Thursdays or Fridays</u> depending on your area. Recycling is still picked up every other week, and green waste is picked up every week during the green waste pick-up season (Apr. 1-Oct. 31). Also, for **holidays**, if your service day falls during the week of an <u>observed holiday</u>, your service that week *may* be delayed by one day, but you should still put your cans out on your regular day (also note that WM may pick up on Saturday if your service is delayed a day). If you have questions about your specific regular pick-up day, please call us at 435-752-1310 and select Option 1.

NORTH PARK POLICE

North Park Police officers have seen an uptick in the number of sextortion scams that are being reported. Sextortion is the practice of extorting money or sexual favors from someone by threatening to reveal evidence of their sexual activity, or in some cases, alleged sexual activity. Some scams claim the victim looks at pornographic websites and preys upon a victim's fear of that information being made public. Often, the scam threatens to release video or still pictures to all of the victims' contacts, friends, and on their social media unless a payment of money/Bitcoin is made. The letter will include an email address or Bitcoin address where the payment is to be sent.

We want our citizens to understand that this is a scam and should be reported to the Police Department. Please do not send any money or payment that the scammer is demanding. Our detectives have seen success as they track down the owners of the email addresses that these scams are coming from and build the case against them. If you or your family have received an email demanding payment, or are the victims of a sextortion scam, please contact the Police Department at (435) 753-7600 or visit our website at <u>www.nppdut.gov</u> to submit a tip.

STREETS

As the weather cools off, our crew will continue crack sealing the roads, weather permitting. We do not plan to have many road closures with this project, and those we do have should last no longer than a couple of hours. Please avoid driving on freshly applied crack seal as it needs time to cure before traffic is reintroduced to those sections.

Asphalt repair will continue throughout this month. With this task, the crew is simply replacing failed spots in the road. This project is very non-invasive to traffic; however, please be aware of traffic cones, signs, etc.

Our crew is also working to replace sidewalks that have been lifted by tree roots, etc. When replacing these sections of concrete, it is necessary to remove the tree roots that are causing the issue. If this is not done, then the roots will continue expanding and will lift the new sidewalk to the point of needing repairs within a few years. Our team will do everything possible to preserve the health of the trees, however, root removal is necessary for continued pedestrian safetv.

We will also be touching up all paint markings, such as crosswalks, stop bars, etc., in the city. This is a time-consuming process where our crews will need to cone off sections of the road to paint. These cones will remain in place until the paint has dried enough to allow traffic to drive on it. Please be mindful and respectful to these areas while they dry, both in respect to our workers, and to prevent paint from getting on your vehicles. We appreciate your cooperation!

STORMWATER

With fall here, leaves will be falling. City workers will be sweeping the streets constantly in an attempt to keep up. You can do your part by keeping your leaves on your own property and not sweeping or blowing them into the street. Dumping leaves into a ditch or drainage swale is also a stormwater violation. Sweeping the gutter out in front of your house would greatly help us and be much appreciated!

With bad weather coming, please help reduce the mess by cleaning up and keeping materials on your property - store materials for final landscaping projects on your property, not the road or gutter. Thank you for doing your part to keep North Logan City clean!

SEWER

Residents, please remember, the only item allowed to go into the city's Sanitary Sewer System aside from natural waste is toilet paper! Please **DO NOT** flush items such as wipes ("flushable" ones actually do not break down in the sewer system), feminine hygiene products, cleaning wipes, paper towels, trash, cloth of any kind, toys, diapers, Q-tips, grease, medications, etc. Please dispose of these products properly in solid waste/trash bins.

1. How can I find out what issues are being discussed at City Council? The North Logan City Council typically meets on the first and third Wednesdays of the month. Agendas are posted on the city's

social media sites, website, and on the public notice website (at https://www.utah.gov/ pmn). We also live-stream our meetings on YouTube (at the following link: https:// www.youtube.com/channel/

UCLiZ99g67CZg1IT4V7yDNkw). You can also sign up to receive our agendas by sending an email requesting so to marie@northlogancity.gov. Additionally, before each meeting, I go through the agenda and explain each item on Instagram (@lyndsaylpeterson).

- 2. How will I know if a development is being proposed near my home? The city sends out text/email/phone calls to residents in close proximity to proposed developments. If you haven't signed up for notifications emailmary@northlogancity.gov to be put on the list
- 3. How do I report an issue? Go to the city's website and fill out the form at https://northlogancity.org/problem-orconcern/ That will create a work order for the correct department to address the issue.
- 4. How can I be more informed about what's going on in North Logan? A few ideas:
 - (a) Request the North Logan newsletter by emailing mary@northlogancity.gov a nd while you're at it, ask her to add you to the city's text alert list.

WATER

With colder temperatures on the horizon, October is the month to have your irrigation systems winterized. Be sure to have your irrigation lines blown out to avoid any breaks. Culinary irrigation systems should have their backflow assembly removed for the winter, or insulated. A broken backflow assembly could potentially put North Logan's water system at risk of contamination. Protecting your home's backflow assembly helps North Logan keep our drinking water protected. Do your part to keep our water safe!

GOOGLE FIBER

Google Fiber installation will be ongoing throughout the fall and winter. Homeowners with secondary water lines on their property should keep an eye out for any issues. With water off for the winter, it will be difficult to notice any secondary water lines being hit during the Google Fiber installation process. Please keep an eye out for any issues!

LEAD SERVICE LINE INVENTORY

City staff has completed the Lead Service Line Inventory verification process required by the state and the EPA. We have found zero lead service lines in North Logan! Our report was submitted to the state in August where they approved it, months ahead of the national deadline. In fact, North Logan was the first town in Cache Valley to successfully be approved!

We would like to thank the hundreds of households who submitted information to us. Without you, this process would have taken significantly longer. But because of you, we as a community were successful!
