GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council meetings in November will take place on Wednesdays, Nov. 6th & 20th, at 6:30 p.m., in the City Council Chambers at the North Logan City offices (2525 N 600 E). In November, the City Council will be considering the release of the warranty bond for Westview Subdivision. They will also consider approval of the parameters resolution for the DEQ Sewer Trunkline Bond. The annual North Logan Audit report will take place, and there will be a consideration of the boundary adjustment plat between North Logan and Hyde Park related to the Linden Lane Subdivision.

The Planning Commission meetings in November will take place on Thursdays, Nov. 7th & 21st at 6:30 p.m., in the Council Chambers at the North Logan City offices (2525 N 600 E). The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings, or work session discussions on the following topics:

◆Text amendments to refine development requirements within geologic hazard areas; ◆Review of draft General Plan chapters and content; ♦ Review of a conditional use permit request to operate a short-term rental at 2887 Daines Way; and, ◆Review of a City Center Development Plan for a 55+ single-family subdivision located at ~ 300E 2400N.

GARBAGE PICK UP (Cans need to be out by 6 a.m.)

Pick-up days for all North Logan garbage services are on either Thursdays or Fridays depending on your area. Recycling is still picked up every other week, and green waste is picked up every week during the green waste pick-up season (Apr. 1-Oct. 31). Also, for holidays, if your service day falls during the week of an observed holiday, your service that week may be delayed by one day, but you should still put your cans out on your regular day (also note that WM may pick up on Saturday if your service is delayed a day). Many of us will shop for gifts online as the holidays get closer. To that end, I would like to offer some suggestions to help you



keep your packages and orders safe. A lockbox on your porch, or a lockbox at the post office, are terrific ways to keep your packages secure and out of sight. Track your packages. Delays happen, and if you have a tracking number, you can see if the package is still in

transit. If your package shows delivered but you do not have it, check with your neighbors. Oftentimes, packages are delivered to the wrong address, or a neighbor innocently takes it home with their mail. If you still cannot find the package, contact the seller and file a claim. If the retailer will not assist you, then consider filing a claim with the shipping company. These simple steps will help reduce your stress level.

FALL CLEAN-UP DAY GREEN WASTE

On Saturday, November 16th, North Logan City will provide several dumpsters for green waste in the north parking lot of Elk Ridge Park, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., or until the bins are full. This service will be for North Logan City residents only (not for commercial or non-resident use), and will be free of charge for that day.

SENIOR LUNCHEON

STREETS

For the month of November, our crew will continue to crack seal the roads, as long as weather permits. We do not plan to have many road closures with this project, and those we do have should last no longer than a couple of hours. Please avoid driving on freshly applied crack seal as it needs time to cure before traffic is reintroduced to those sections.

Beginning November 1st and ending March 31st the Winter Parking Ordinance (11-604) is in effect. This means vehicles/trailers/RV's, etc., cannot be parked on city streets, curbs, and shoulders between 12:00 a.m. thru 6:00 a.m. on any given day. Please let your family and friends know, as citations will be issued during these hours. Do not put your garbage/recycling out the night before if it looks like there will be snow during the night. During other hours, if it is snowing, or beginning to snow, we would appreciate you not parking on the streets, so that our snow plows can keep your roads clean and safe for you and your family.

Also, when clearing the snow from your driveways, please remember it is against the law to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers! Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, exercisers, and children trying to pass on their way to school. We appreciate your cooperation!

STORMWATER

With us being heavy into the fall season, here are a few reminders about fallen leaves:

- 1. Please keep leaves from your property, on your property as much as possible.
- City workers will run our street sweeper as much as possible to keep up with leaves. However, it is a large city with only one truck. We cannot be everywhere at once. Keeping the gutter clean in front of your house, and especially storm drains clear, greatly helps city crews.
- There is always a chance of precipitation at this time. To help drain rain, sleet, or melting snow properly, please keep leaves from piling in the gutter.

November also means a chance for snow. Remember to keep piled snow out of the gutter and off the street. Also, avoid using too much ice melt, which is a source of water pollutants when used in excess.

Thanks for your help in keeping our city and water clean.

GOOGLE FIBER

Google Fiber installation will be ongoing throughout the fall and winter. Homeowners with secondary water lines on their property should keep an eye out for any issues. With water off for the winter, it will be difficult to notice any secondary water lines being hit during the Google Fiber installation process. Please keep an eye out for any issues!

MAYOR'S FAQ

In early 2022, Logan City announced that they would no longer be offering garbage, green waste, or recycling pick-up. Since that time, North Logan City has joined the Cache Waste Consortium (CWC) in contracting with Waste Management to provide garbage hauling services for our area.

- When will be the last day green waste bins will be picked up this year?
 On Friday, November 1st.
- 2. Will we ever get the green waste dumpsters back in Elk Ridge Park?

The dumpsters will only be available for designated green waste clean-up days, and only once or twice a year. The fall clean-up day this year will be on Saturday, November 16, 2025, from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m. -- or until the bins are full, at the north end of Elk Ridge Park.

3. I hear Logan City will start charging for green waste drop-off at the Logan Landfill after the first of the year. Is there anything North Logan City can do about this?

The short answer is no. Logan City sets their own rates. We anticipate that Logan will be charging \$10 per load, for car or regular truck loads, beginning January 1, 2025.

EMERGENCY DOOR HANGER PROGRAM

North Logan City will be providing Emergency Door Hangers for its residents to place on their door or window in the event of a catastrophic disaster. Posting a "Red/Green" Emergency Door Hanger will create visibility in our neighborhoods and aid Community Emergency Responders. Please place it in a secure location. In the event of a catastrophic disaster, please complete the following:

- 1) Verify the needs of your household
- Hang the "RED" side, facing the road, if you require medical attention or assistance.
- Hang the "GREEN" side, facing the road, if all is well in your household.

SEWER

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.

WATER

With colder temperatures still to come, you can have your irrigation systems winterized in November, if you haven't already. Be sure to have your irrigation lines blown out to avoid any breaks. Culinary irrigation systems should have their backflow assembly removed for the winter, or insulated. A broken backflow assembly could potentially put North Logan's water system at risk of contamination. Protecting your home's backflow assembly helps North Logan keep the drinking water protected. Do your part to keep our water safe!

WATER METER LIDS

We want to remind our residents to please be mindful and careful of the North Logan City water meter lids on your property. No one is allowed to open



these lids or tamper with them in any way (including homeowners, contractors, utility workers, etc.) except for official North Logan City staff. If you are confronted with any issues regarding these, please contact the City offices at (435)752-1310, and you will be directed to the appropriate staff member who will be happy to assist you. These meter lids have very sensitive antennas that can be easily broken or damaged. This not only interferes with the signal that gives the city the correct read from the meters with which to charge homeowners for their culinary water use; but when damaged, city staff has to go in and replace these components, which is not an easy, nor inexpensive task. Please keep in mind that any damages done to the meters or antennas which results in replacement, will be done so at the homeowners' expense. Please also make sure that these meter lids on your property remain clear of obstructions such as overgrown grass, vegetation, bark or other landscaping, vehicles, lawn decorations, etc. These obstructions not only interfere with the signal used to obtain correct reads; the city also needs access for emergencies, as well as for maintenance. We greatly appreciate your cooperation.
