GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The <u>one</u> City Council meeting in December will take place on Wednesday, December 11th, at 6:30 p.m., in the City Council Chambers at the North Logan City offices (2525 N 600 E). In December, the City Council will hold a public hearing regarding the sewer bond, to pay for a portion of the sewer trunkline to Logan. There will be a consideration of a bid to install a chlorine contact chamber at the North Logan Water Treatment Plant. There will also be discussions of dates and times for upcoming City Council meetings in 2025.

The Planning Commission will only meet once in December, on Thursday, December 12th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the North Logan City offices. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold workshops, public meetings, or work session discussions on the following topics:

- ◆Review of draft General Plan chapters and content; and,
- ◆Review of a Preliminary Plat and Subdivision Improvement Plans for a proposed 55+ single-family subdivision on Parcel ID: 04-060-0027.

GARBAGE PICK UP (Cans need to be out by 6 a.m.)

Pick-up days for all North Logan garbage services are on either Thursdays or Fridays depending on your area. Recycling is still picked up every other week, and green waste is picked up every week during the green waste pick-up season (Apr. 1-Oct. 31). Also, for holidays, if your service day falls during the week of an observed holiday, your service that week may be delayed by one day, but you should still put your cans out on your regular day (also note that WM may pick up on Saturday if your service is delayed a day). If you have questions about your specific regular pick-up day, please call us at 435-752-1310 and select Option 1.

NORTH PARK POLICE

Ready or not, winter is here to stay. When the snow flies, our city snowplow drivers are hindered in their ability to quickly remove the snow from the roads when cars are parked illegally on the street. Please remember:

Parking restrictions outlined:

11-604 Winter Street Maintenance-Overnight Parking **Prohibited**

No person shall park a vehicle or trailer on any roadway or city-owned parking lot without it being attended by someone able to immediately remove the same between the hours of midnight (12:00) a.m. and six o'clock (6:00) a.m. of any day, beginning November 1st and ending March 31st of the following year, except health care professionals and/or emergency support personnel during emergency calls.

Our officers will be issuing citations to those who violate the overnight parking ordinance.

We ask that you clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home. Please remember, it is against the law to push or blow snow into the street. We want our residents to navigate through the storms safely. This is a great time to go out and inspect your vehicle's equipment. Do your tires have proper traction, or are they bald? Please consider replacing them if needed. If your windshield wipers are cracked or broken, they cannot adequately clear snow or water from the windshield.

When going out, please brush/scrape ALL the snow from your windshields and allow time for them to defrost. Often, officers see motorists who have scraped a 6" peephole for the driver to look through, while the rest of the car windows are covered with ice or snow. Speed is a large contributing factor in crashes. When winter conditions are present, slow your speed, increase your following distance, and allow yourself plenty of time to reach your destination. Consider the peace of mind that comes by being prepared with a winter emergency kit in your car. A good winter kit consists of a warm coat, gloves, stocking, water bottles, extra food, a flashlight and batteries, and a strong tow strap, as a minimum.

STREETS

We ask you to please keep in mind that when snow is forecast, it is helpful when our citizens remove vehicles, trailers, garbage cans, etc. from the roadway. By doing this, our plow drivers are able to clear the entire road, which helps prevent bottlenecking, as well as damage to vehicles and property. We appreciate everyone's cooperation during our winter months! Thank you for your support!!

Also, when clearing the snow from your driveways, please remember it is <u>against the law</u> to push or blow snow into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and plowers. Please also be sure to clean the snow from the sidewalks in front of your home for the safety of the elderly, people in wheelchairs, and children trying to pass on their way to school. Thank you for your cooperation!

SNOW PLOWING ON CHRISTMAS DAY

Special thanks to the fastest, and most amazing snow plow crew in the world. We believe they deserve a break to be with their families. So, if we have a white Christmas, the plow crew will not start at their normal hour of 4 a.m. Instead, they will start plowing around noon on Christmas day.

STORMWATER

December is here and that means snow is coming. Here are a few reminders concerning snow and our storm drain system:

- 1. Do not pile snow on any storm drain and keep the snow out of the curb and gutter.
- 2. Keep your snow on your property and don't pile it in the streets.
- 3. Avoid overusing ice melt to keep pollutants out of the storm drain system.

A few other reminders:

- Leaves are still falling. Our city truck is out and about sweeping gutters. Please assist us in keeping leaves away from drains. Thanks for all your efforts already made.
- As much as possible, keep any mud on your property, and clean up after yourself if a mess is made.
- Avoid storing materials or trash cans and other objects on the road for long periods.
 This will assist us with plowing and sweeping, and will help ensure a functioning storm drain system.

Thank you for your efforts and cooperation to help ensure we have a clean city.

GOOGLE FIBER

Google Fiber installation will be ongoing throughout the fall and winter. Homeowners with secondary water lines on their property should keep an eye out for any issues. With water off for the winter, it will be difficult to notice any secondary water lines being hit during the Google Fiber installation process. Please keep an eye out for any issues!

SEWER

We have seen an increase in the use of flushable wipes entering our wastewater system. Contrary to being labeled as "flushable," flushable wipes are a major problem for our sewer system. Unlike toilet paper, flushable wipes do not break down easily in water. Flushable wipes tend to form large clumps that can block city sewer lines, and even your home's sewer service line, leading to future issues and backups. The safest way to dispose of flushable wipes is to discard them in the trash, not the toilet! Even if a product is considered flushable, it's best to avoid flushing it.



WATER

If you are leaving town this holiday season for any period of time, ensure that your heater stays on to avoid any water pipes from freezing!

WATER METER LIDS

We want to remind our residents to please be mindful and careful of the North Logan City water meter lids on your property. No one is allowed to open these lids or tamper with



them in any way (including homeowners, contractors, utility workers, etc.) except for official North Logan City staff. If you are confronted with any issues regarding these, please contact the City offices at (435)752-1310, and you will be directed to the appropriate staff member who will be happy to assist you. These meter lids have very sensitive antennas that can be easily broken or damaged. This not only interferes with the signal that gives the city the correct read from the meters with which to charge homeowners for their culinary water use; but when damaged, city staff has to go in and replace these components, which is not an easy, nor inexpensive task. Please keep in mind that any damages done to the meters or antennas which results in replacement, will be done so at the homeowners' <u>expense</u>. Please also make sure that these meter lids on your property remain clear of obstructions such as overgrown grass, vegetation, bark or other landscaping, vehicles, lawn decorations, etc. These obstructions not only interfere with the signal used to obtain correct reads; the city also needs access for emergencies, as well as for maintenance. SEWER RATES

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year.
