GARBAGE PICK UP (Cans need to be out by 6 a.m.)

Pick-up days for <u>all North Logan garbage services</u> are on either <u>Thursdays or Fridays</u> depending on your area. Recycling is still picked up every other week (starting with the first week in January for 2025, and then every other week); and green waste is picked up every week during the green waste pick-up season (April 1 thru October 31). For **holidays**, if your service day falls during the week of an <u>observed holiday</u>, your service that week *may* be delayed by one day, but you should still put your cans out on your regular day (also note that Waste Management may pick up on Sat. if your service is delayed a day). If you have questions about your specific regular pick-up day, please call us at 435-752-1310 x 1.

NORTH PARK POLICE

With the new year starting, I wanted to take a moment and provide some insight into the great work our police officers have done this past year. In 2024, the North Park Police Agency handled 5,874 calls for service. A call for service is generated when a citizen calls Dispatch and requests an officer's assistance, reports an unsafe driver, or reports an emergency. Calls for service are also generated by our Investigations Division when they get reports of abuse/theft/extortion, etc. In 2024, the agency handled 154 more calls for service than in 2023.

I have received many compliments from citizens regarding how often they have seen NPPD officers on traffic stops throughout the community. In 2024, our officers logged 3,780 traffic stops, an increase of 1,420 more than in 2023. Historically, each stop takes approximately 15 minutes. That equates to an additional 355 more hours our officers were able to dedicate to traffic enforcement this year compared to last year. The added presence throughout the community has slowed down motorists, made our crosswalks safer, and helped improve the quality of life we enjoy. I am pleased to report that North Park Police officers investigated 38 drivers suspected of driving under the influence, an increase of 17 more than in 2023, and helped to mitigate that danger to the community. Our officers have made a concerted effort to be seen in the school zones in the morning, and have taken time to consistently walk through and get to know the elementary kids in our schools. Our detectives have presented numerous training courses on fraud prevention, and how parents can help mitigate the threat of sextortion to our children. It has been a very busy year indeed.

GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council will meet on Wednesdays, February 5th & 19th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the North Logan City offices. In February, the City Council will be considering updates to the City's Water Conservation Plan, and Design Standards Technical Manual (DSTM). Draft FY2026 Budget Proposals will take place for Planning, Building Inspection, Fire, Economic Development, Parks, Cemetery, and Recreation Depts. There will also be considerations of an updated Logan Wastewater Treatment Impact Fee.

The Planning Commission will meet on Thursdays, February 6th & 20th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the North Logan City offices. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public meetings on the following topics: ◆ Formal consideration and recommendation of the 2025 General Plan, including an update to the City Center Master Plan;

♦ Review of a Preliminary Plat and Subdivision Improvement Plans for the Village Springs Subdivision, a proposed 55+ single-family subdivision, on Parcel ID: 04-060-0027; and, ♦ Review of draft code amendments intended to implement the goals and policies of the 2025 General Plan.

2025 General Plan Re-Write Project: The city anticipates that the final draft of the 2025 General Plan and updated City Center Master Plan will be formally reviewed by the Planning Commission in February. STREETS

We ask you to please keep in mind that when snow is forecast, it is helpful when our citizens remove vehicles, trailers, garbage cans, etc. from the roadway. STORMWATER

CITY COUNCIL RECAP From the Mayor

What happened this week at City Council?

I'll be continuing to do recap and preview videos on my Instagram page (@lyndsaylpeterson), but in the future, I'll be adding a short recap of meetings in the newsletter so you can know what you missed.

- We approved revisions to the FY2025 budget to adjust for expenses and revenue in our CERT, parade, code enforcement, and other items. There will be more budget adjustments as we approach the end of our fiscal year, and each of those changes will be accompanied by a public hearing.
- We approved routine updates to the drinking water source protection plan as recommended by Public Works Director, Jordan Oldham.
- We tabled discussion about edits to the Design Standards Technical Manual, pending engineering drawings.
- We discussed strategic directives at length; Mark Hancey focused on being involved with state legislation; Joni Kartchner wanted to continue to focus on responsible growth; Kenny Reese, Emily Schmidt, and Buzzy Mullahkhel discussed carrying some of our existing goals across the finish line this year.
- We heard about a \$400,000 design grant that our Public Works Department worked hard to secure. Those funds will go toward the new water tanks and other water capital improvement projects. Work on those projects will begin in March.

As always, we love to hear from you! Let us know if you have any ideas on goals the council should focus on for 2025.
