GOVERNMENT MEETINGS (Agendas: pmn.utah.gov)

The City Council will meet on Wednesdays, February 5th & 19th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the North Logan City offices. In March, the City Council will be considering updates to the North Logan City Design Standards Technical Manual. There will be a discussion regarding a proposed increase to the Logan City Dispatch Fee. FY2026 Budget proposals will take place for the following departments: Stormwater, Streets, Sewer, Water, Library, and Fire.

The Planning Commission will meet on Thursdays, March 6th & 20th at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the North Logan City offices. The Planning Commission tentatively plans to hold public meetings on the following topics: ♦ Review of a Preliminary Plat and Subdivision Improvement Plans for the Village Springs Subdivision, a proposed 55+ single-family subdivision, on Parcel ID: 04-060-0027 (~ 2300 N Wolf Pack Way).♦ Review of a Preliminary Plat and Subdivision Improvement Plans for the North Logan Self Storage Subdivision, a proposed two-lot commercial subdivision on Parcel ID: 04-080-0015 (~ 2040 N 200 W)., ♦ Review of draft code amendments intended to implement the goals and policies of the 2025 General Plan.

GARBAGE PICK UP (Cans need to be out by 6 a.m.)

Pick-up days for <u>all North Logan garbage services</u> are on either <u>Thursdays or Fridays</u> depending on your area. Recycling is still picked up every other week (starting with the first week in January for 2025, and then every other week); and green waste is picked up every week during the green waste pick-up season (April 1 thru October 31). For **holidays**, if your service day falls during the week of an <u>observed holiday</u>, your service that week *may* be delayed by one day, but you should still put your cans out on your regular day (also note that Waste Management may pick up on Sat. if your service is delayed a day). NORTH PARK POLICE

Recently there has been a lot of attention in the media regarding President Trump's immigration policies. Many who live within our city are concerned about the potential impact these policies might have on their families. As Chief, I wanted to take the opportunity to address these concerns and hopefully offer some reassurance.

In the last several years, North Park Police officers have strived to improve and foster a good working relationship with community members by being more visible on the streets, walking through elementary schools interacting with kids, and giving more public presentations. As Chief, I feel these efforts are paying off and that the community appreciates having a visible police presence.

However, there are still many challenges to overcome, for both law enforcement and community members whose immigration status would be considered illegal by current policies. These challenges can include lack of trust in law enforcement due to past experiences, language barriers, or differences in cultural norms. This might cause a person to hesitate in reaching out to law enforcement for help due to fear that their immigration status would be questioned.

I want to reassure our community members that North Park Police officers are <u>NOT</u>:

- asking for immigration status,
- calling ICE to report potential immigration violations,
- or focusing traffic enforcement on any particular demographic.

Our officers will continue to provide professional police services by protecting members from public safety threats, completing thorough investigations, and handling calls for service. There have been no requests to change the current day-to-day operating procedures from outside agencies. STREETS

We want to remind our citizens that our winter parking ordinance is effect until April 1st, from 12am-6am. Please keep in mind that when snow is in the forecast, it is helpful when our citizens remove their vehicles, trailers, garbage cans, etc. from the roadway. By doing this, our snowplow drivers are able to clear the entire width of the road, which helps prevent bottlenecking, as well as damage to vehicles and property. Additionally, when clearing the snow from your driveways, please remember it is against the law to push or blow it into the street, as it is a danger to drivers and our snowplowers. We also kindly ask that you remove the snow from the sidewalks in front of your property to ensure the safety of all pedestrians on their way to school or work. We appreciate everyone's cooperation and support during the winter months!

STORMWATER

With warmer weather more than likely on the way, please remember the following:

- Winter leaves the gutters dirty. We will be sending our street sweeper out for a spring cleaning. Please be patient with us; we will hit every road and neighborhood.
- As the snow melts, sometimes storm grates get plugged up. We will monitor this, but if you notice one that is plugged, feel free to call the city office and we will come clean it up. You are also welcome to help clear it as well.
- As you begin landscaping or other projects around your property, please remember it is a violation to store any materials in the road or in the curb and gutter.

NPPD - CODE ENFORCEMENT

Parking Rules and Regulations

Parking a vehicle in any of the following places is not allowed:

- On any roadway or city owned property for forty-eight (48) or more consecutive hours;
- On a sidewalk;
- In front of or within five (5) feet of a public or private driveway;
- Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant;
- On a crosswalk;
- Within twenty (20) feet of a crosswalk at an intersection.

SEWER

North Logan City has recently added a brand-new vacuum and jetting truck to the Sewer Department's fleet. With this addition, we can now more efficiently monitor, inspect, and clean sewer lines and manholes throughout the city. This upgraded equipment also allows us to respond to emergencies faster than ever before. As a result, you will see us more frequently in neighborhoods, working to maintain the system and ensure everything runs smoothly.

Due to our increased monitoring, we've noticed a rising trend of flushable wipes being disposed of improperly. While they may be labeled as "flushable," these wipes are a significant problem for our sewer system. Unlike toilet paper, they don't break down, which can cause blockages and lead to backups. We strongly urge you to dispose of flushable wipes in the trash, not the toilet. Thank you for doing your part to protect our wastewater system!

SEWER RATES

North Logan City sewer rates are based on a six month average winter WATER usage (November – April). This is done to ensure that the average water usage does not include culinary water used outdoors in the summer. Your Winter Average is recalculated each year in June, so using less water during winter months by turning off your sprinkler system and watching for leaks, can help you save money on your utility bill all year. WATER

North Logan's Cross-Connection Control Program ensures that our public drinking water supply is safe and protected. Each year, we conduct an annual hazard assessment at each commercial, industrial, and institutional property, inside and out. We check each of these businesses for any potential contamination threats, and ensure that all proper backflow assemblies are installed. Each year, hundreds of backflow assemblies are tested in North Logan, each one responsible for stopping any potential backflows of water. We would like to thank our business owners for being committed to ensuring that our water system remains safe at all times.

RABIES CLINIC

The CVPA (Cache Veterinary Practitioners Association) is sponsoring a rabies clinic as a fundraiser for Utah State University Medicine veterinary student scholarships and veterinary continuing education programs. The rabies clinic will take place on Saturday, March 15th, from 10am to Noon, at the Elk Ridge Park Lions Bldg. (1111 E 2500 N). The vaccinations will be provided by veterinary students in the USU veterinary medicine program under the oversight of a local practitioner. The cost for each vaccination will be \$25.00, payable in cash or check only.

An up to date rabies shot and license are required for dogs residing in North Logan. Licensing can be completed at the North Logan City Offices at 2525 N 600 E.
