North Logan City 2025 Municipal Election

North Logan City will hold its 2025 Municipal Election to elect a Mayor and two Council Members. Mayor and Council Members serve four-year terms and are elected at large.

Dates to know:

- * Candidate Filing period: June 2-6, 2025
- * Primary Election: Tuesday, August 12, 2025 (if necessary)
- * General Election: Tuesday, November 4, 2025

Those interested in filing for one of these offices must: Be a U.S. Citizen at the time of filing; Be a registered voter of North Logan City, Be at least 18 years old; Be a resident of North Logan City for at least 365 days immediately preceding the date of the General Election (November 2, 2025); and not be a convicted felon.

Candidate Filing Period is from 8:00 a.m. on Monday, June 2, 2025 and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, June 6, 2025. Declaration of Candidacy Form or Nomination Petition must be filed in person at the North Logan City Recorder's Office located at 2525 North 600 East, North Logan, UT. There is no filing fee. Candidates are subject to financial disclosure requirements identified in UCA 10-3-208.

Mayor's FAQ

What's the latest with the county-wide recreation center discussion?

The Cache County Council funded phase I of a feasibility study and awarded a contract to VCBO, a firm with a proven track record of sustainable recreation center planning. The County Council has demonstrated a willingness to fund the second and final phase of the study once phase one is complete. The second phase will include a statistically valid survey of residents, which is a necessary precursor to seeking funding for a future center.

What are the next steps?

I've been appointed to a seven member steering committee along with Sandi Goodlander, David Zook, Mayor Daines, Mayor Jacobsen and two citizen representatives. We'll be making sure VCBO explores all of the important aspects of potentially funding and building a recreation center such as; Where will the recreation center be located? Will we have a north and a south rec center? What kinds of facilities will be included in the rec center? How will the center be managed? How will a rec center be funded?

How can I be involved?

Look for questionnaires that North Logan city will pass along to you. We want to get your input and to address any issues or needs you have.

This is an exciting, collaborative project and we'll continue to keep you in the loop as we move along in this process.

Stormwater

Spring is right around the corner, and depending on the weather, the State DWQ would like us to be aware of a few reminders for lawn care and maintenance:

1. Only fertilize once you have cut your grass a minimum of three times.
2. A common myth is that more is synonymous with better when discussing lawn health. That isn't always the case! Someone should only use two pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet for the best results.
3. Spot treat weeds when you can't handpick them, and don't douse the entire area.
4. If the forecast has rain or any other wet weather event, try not to spread or apply fertilizer and pesticides.
5. Sweep driveways and sidewalks rather than wash them with a hose.

Following these guidelines will help your lawn be healthy and help keep our water quality high and pollutants-free. Thanks for all that you do.

Code Enforcement

In a residential zone, no portion of the front and side yard area (where grass or plant would customarily be planted) shall be used for parking. Access across the front yard is allowed to get to the side or rear yards.

Streets

Summer maintenance is under way. Our crew will be crack-sealing roads around town that are in need of maintenance. This is a relatively quick process. However, the oil used to fill the cracks in the road does need time to dry before traffic drives on it. We will primarily only be shifting traffic lanes, but will only close travel lanes when necessary.

We will also be building up the shoulder of a few roads scattered throughout town. Please be aware of our city employees in the roadway as they work to improve our city infrastructure.

Water

With April underway, it is important to know that your summer sewer rates are determined by your water usage. Cut costs by postponing lawn watering until summer. Less water used equals a lower water bill and sewer bill.

The 2025 statewide Utah Shakeout is on April 17th, at 10:15 am. when Utahns will participate in earthquake drills at work, school or home, practicing Earthquake Safety and other aspects of their Emergency Plans. The drill aims to improve earthquake preparedness and safety skills for Utah residents. We encourage everyone to participate from individuals in their home (or even car) to a school and even a major corporate office. "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" offers the best overall level of protection in most situations. As with anything, practice makes perfect. On the evening of April 17th, North Logan City will also be conducting a Communications Drill. As part of the drill, CERT Teams and Neighborhood Rapid Assessment Tool Teams will be working at various locations throughout the City as we continue to improve and exercise our City Emergency Operating Plan.
